Studious readers of Hire Magazine over the last few months will have realised from the Queensland "News and Views" that this state has recently participated in a Home Show exhibition.


The show was sponsored by the metropolitan afternoon paper the "Telegraph" and attracted a record number of entrants.

KENT HIRE SERVICE: the ultimate planned yard?

On my recent trip to Melbourne, I was indeed fortunate to be taken on a visit to the yard of Kent Hire Service, run and operated by Fred Kent.

With my limited experience in the industry, I don't profess to be a walking, talking expert on Hire yards, far from it. I realise that what meets the eye isn't necessarily what goes on. Nevertheless the way the yard of Kent's Hire Service has been laid out and is maintained, is to my uneducated gaze a thing of absolute beauty and precision.

I was taken to the yard of Kent Hire Service by Brian Elms, the President of the Victorian branch of the Hire Association.

Fred Kent showed us around his yard, with obvious pride, and related the story of how it all started.

He commenced trading back in 1964 from the backyard of his home in East Bentleigh in a partnership formed between himself and a friend, Kelvin Harvey.

Later they moved to premises in Centre Road, where they remained for a period of nine years until they outgrew the land available for expansion.

It was obvious then to Fred and his partner that new and larger premises were needed. A site of about one acre was on the market and was considered as suitable. An offer was made and accepted. Within a month of purchase, in May 1975, they were offered \$75,000 more than the original price, by the same agent!

Before any actual development occurred on the site, Kelvin and Fred took independant fact finding trips to Europe and America to learn of the latest developments that could be utilised to advantage.

A building was commissioned that utilised the maximum cost saving. The floor was poured concrete,

the walls double brick and the roof allows the maximum amount of natural light to be utilised, using fibreglass sheets, anodised windows and colorbond fascias and cappings for long life.

Sufficient room is available for additional expansion as and when it is required.

The first area the customer enters by foot, is the showroom area – complete with carpet and air conditioning. From here one can wander through into

the storage area and view the immaculately laid out equipment. A place for everything and everything in its place.

Eight paid workers are on the payroll and the equipment is diversified into Builders, handyman, household, medical and party hire.


The area outside the building allows enough room for buses or even semi-trailers to turn around. Even the doors have been designed to allow for a drive in the store at one point and a drive out at another.

Fred maintains a steam clean area where all medical equipment plus barbecues and other items subject to dirt and grease are cleaned after each hire period.

Total area of the site is 43,000 square feet, with the office showroom taking 1,600 square feet. The store area is 8,000 square feet.

And if you think everything is perfect....don't believe it. Ask Fred to point out the only error he could find in the builders'work. It concerns a side door, where by some mishap there was no allowance made for the six inch concrete floor. Thus the door is only 6' 2" high.

We are indebted to Fred Kent for his time in allowing us to write this story and for the provision of the technical facts. To any interstate visitor to Melbourne we suggest you give Fred a call and pop out and have a view yourself of his yard.

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A few months ago one of our more vocal members suggested we run a series of articles on the various sets of equipment as used by Hire Companies.

An excellent idea, but not as easy as it first sounds. The first problem we came up against was isolating the exact type of information that you people require. In the case of air compressors, where do we start and where do we stop. Some companies offer a wealth of material. Others seem surprised when you even request data to publish.

We decided in the case of air compressors to feature the latest model from each of the four major suppliers.

When we actually came down to it their is really only four major suppliers of air compressors in Australia. They are of course Compair, Atlas Copco, Ingersoll-Rand and Sullair.

All these four companies supply a wide range of

compressors from small portables up to the larger units. All have a vigorous attitude to the marketing of their products using either their own state branch network or else a distributorship pattern.

In addition there are the usual peripheral quantity of multi-stockists and second hand organisations which most Hire Companies are very much aware of.

Most Hire Companies would hire out compressors as an integral part of their turnover. In the selecting of replacement machinery we would suggest you get in touch with your local representative from all four of the above companies and arrange a demonstration of the types and sizes of units you are specifically looking for. Compare prices, outputs, maintenance, etc.

The type and size of unit your business requires is known only to you. So check around.

SULLAIR 125Q QUIET SCREW COMPRESSOR

Sullair Australia Limited is about to release the 125Q diesel powered, rotary screw mobile compressor.

The 125Q, the 'baby' of the Sullair range, is powered by a Perkins 4 cylinder, 4 cycle diesel engine and is capable of delivering up to 59 l/sec (125cfm) of free air against working pressures up to 860 kPa (125psig).

Specific features of the 1250 include:

Quiet Operation: The 125Q is designed to meet EPA requirements of 76 dBA at 7 meters. 2-year warranty: SulliscrewTM air end is warranted for

two years against defects in material and workmanship ... and loss of capacity caused by wear.

Sullicon[™] Control: Combines diaphragm, spring, and back pressure regulator for 100% demand output control of engine and compressor.

Good Mobility: The 125Q is easy to tow at highway speeds. A-frame draw-bar with 2" ball hitch has screwtype support that's operated by crank for easy height adjustment.

Curbside Instruments: Located behind hinged lockable doors, instruments include all necessary operating controls, ammeter, engine oil pressure gauge, engine water temperature gauge, air pressure gauge, startstop control, hourmeter, and manual choke.

Protective Controls: Machine shuts down automatically in case of low engine oil pressure or high compressor discharge temperature. Automatic compressor oil temperature control system provides fast compressor warmup and constant control of oil temperature. Minimum pressure device assures correct pressure in receiver.

Other Standard Features: Dry air filter, with maintenance signal, provides clean air for engine and compressor. Receiver, with two-stage oil separator and two 3/4" service valves, has 1.2 cubic feet capacity. Full flow oil filter has replaceable element. Canopy is easily removed for access.

COMPAIR'S CR330-SEQ PORTABLE DIESEL COMPRESSOR.

A newly introduced 330 cfm assymetric screw unit increases the "C" range.

The Holman Cr 330-SEQ portable rotary screw compressor is an extension of the "C" series range incorporating high efficiency assymetric rotors with an output of 156 l/s (330 cfm) at 690 kPa (100 psi). Running at full load on a hard noise reflecting surface, in accordance with ISO 2151, this compressor has a noise level of 70 dB(A) at 7 metres. This low level of noise has been achieved by following the already successful "Total Tuning" concept of compressor silencing. Engine exhaust noise is effectively controlled by two stage silencing.

Engine:

The engine is a Perkins six cylinder 6-354-4 diesel, a heavy duty premium version of the well established 6-354 engine with load conditions well within continuous power rating.

Compressor unit:

The compressor is a single rotary screw unit effectively sealed, cooled and lubricated by oil flooding.

Heavy duty, dry type air intake filters are fitted to both engine and compressor, Hydraulic pistons on both rotors effectively reduce rotor bearing thrust loads.

Five ³/₄" BSP cocks and one 1¹/₂" BSP plug are provided.

Suspension and canopy:

The compressor and engine units are mounted on a rugged chassis supported on a heavy axle and semi-

elliptic springs. It is fitted with a retractable jockey wheel, over-run braking mechanism and parking hand brake.

The canopy is constructed of sheet metal, bolted in position and fitted with lockable access doors. Cooling air for engine and compressor is drawn into the canopy by "pusher" fan.

Controls and protection equipment:

Controls include compressor oil pressure and engine oil pressure gauges, engine coolant temperature gauge, tachourometer, stop/start controls and circuit itolating switch.

Shut down safety protection is provided as standard and is designed to stop the engine at pre-determined settings of engine coolant temperature, engine and compressor oil temperature and pressure.

The CR330 is built at Compair's Mt. Waverley (Vic) plant and is gaining wide acceptance among hire companies in Australia. Recent orders include twenty one units for the Sydney MWS & DB.

ATLAS COPCO'S ECONOMICAL PORTABLE SCREW COMPRESSORS FOR SMALL JOBS

Portable rotary screw compressors for civil engineering have gained in importance because of their reliability and economy. As this trend in favour of screw compressors persisted, it became clear that the market would soon need screw compressors of lower capacities. Atlas Copco have therefore developed two new screw compressors with capacities of 40 to 50 l/s and designed for utmost economy over their total life cycle. The two new models, designated XAS40 and XAS50, represent the lower end of Atlas Copco's existing XA range of oil-flooded screw compressors with capacities of 59 to 350 l/s at working pressures of 7, 12 and 20 bar in standard, silenced and supersilenced versions. The noise level of the XAS40 and XAS50, is 75 dB(A).

The use of light components allows compact assembly and enables the XAS40 and XAS50 to manoeuvre safely and easily even in difficult terrain.

The compressors are equipped with a heavy-duty towbar with a retractable support leg, incorporating overrun and parking brakes as standard features. The well-balanced bodywork and the low centre of gravity ensure excellent road-holding and towing by almost any vehicle. And they are easy to operate and monitor because of their protected, easy-to-read built-in instrument and control panel at the front.

XAS40 and XAS50 units have a single-stage compression chamber with oil-flooded asymmetric screws for superior air compression.

An aircooled Deutz diesel engine directly drives the male rotor of the compressor element be means of a flexible coupling.

Because there are few moving parts in the "no friction - no wear" compressor, the lifetime of the screw element is almost unlimited. The integrated SKF rotor bearings have a calculated lifetime of at least 40,000 hours under full load running conditions.

The compressor is equipped with an electrical fail safe shut down system which will stop the engine in case of compressor overheating or engine V-belt failure.


A service indicator shows when servicing is required and signals if and when the paper cartridge of the preseparator intake filter needs to be cleaned or changed. Oil changes for the cooling and lubricating system are recommended after 1000 hours (for mineral oils in 30°C ambient temperature conditions).

XAS40 and XAS50 compressors will be used mainly with matching Atlas Copco TEX breakers for small demolition jobs, asphalt cutting and patching, concrete breaking, trimming and finishing jobs. Other applications include light rock drills, pumps, plughole drilling, pile driving by pneumatic breakers, etc.

INGERSOLL-RAND SPIRO-FLO "WHISPERISED" RANGE OF COMPRESSORS

The Ingersoll-Rand 100, 175 & 185 cfm portable compressors have many features that Hire companies consider advantageous.

Amongst these are claims for more air per gallon of fuel, obtained through use of micro finished rotors

which permits closer clearances, greater seal-strip efficiency, less air slippage and reduced surface friction.

Other claimed advantages for the Spiro-flo "whisperised" compressors are now air-oil separators with four times greater surface area; in most applications the element will last indefinately if air and oil filters are properly maintained.

A more efficient cooling fan driven from the compressor end requires 41% less fan horsepower on the P-100 contributing to higher overall efficiency and reduced fuel consumption.

The solid state monitoring system guards against malfunction and provides automatic shutdown for high discharge air temperature, low engine oil pressure or high engine temperature.

LOW PRICED DIESEL FOUR WHEEL DRIVE



Daihatsu has released in Australia a 2.6 litre diesel version of its popular four wheel drive vehicle.

The company claims it is the lowest priced four cylinder diesel four wheel drive in Australia.

The new Daihatsu F50 has been developed in Japan as a result of demand from Australia.

It has 40 percent more torque, but remains economical.

The introduction of the new model coincides with detailed improvements to the F20 1.6 litre petrol engined model.

They include a new bonnet and grille, new rear spring positions, a strengthened front cross member and improved sound deadening.

The general manager of Daihatsu Distributors Pty Ltd (Mr John Conomos) said the growing off-road market was becoming increasingly demanding.

He said there had been a substantial increase in commercial and agricultural use of four wheel drives.

Most were demanding diesel power for parity with their commercial vehicle fleets.

The diesel F50 fulfilled a growing need for a powerful yet medium sized and economic four wheel drive.

It produced 16 kg-m of torque at only 2200RPM (SAE net) and 66bhp at only 3600RPM.

The F50 weighs only 125kg more than its equivalent petrol model, despite being almost 1000cc larger.

Both the F50 and F20 share the same body size and configurations.

They will be available in two forms -


soft top with metal doors

The F20 will cost from \$6881 recommended retail and the F50 will cost from \$7731.

The vehicles are the result of a four year development programme undertaken with the launch of the original F10 Daihatsu in 1974.

Daihatsu engineers have accepted the wide variety of rugged Australian off road conditions as the mean by which their vehicles should be designed.



Total Sales for 1978 were up to \$103,113,496 compared to the 1977 figure of \$74,558,272. (Figures in dollars U.S.)

A corresponding increase in net income was shown at \$6,654,453 compared to the previous year's figure of \$5,939,722.

Today's training movies are subtle, humorous, entertaining and most importantly let the watcher use his or her intelligence to work out the message.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



GORDON DALE

The Hire Industry in N.Z. has reached the stage where many individual firms are interested in the employment of an apprentice but the only schemes under which a person can be employed and which are reasonably relative to our industry are the Automotive or Metal Trade Apprenticeships.

As a result of discussion with the District Commissioner of Apprenticeships, the Hire Association is investigating the possibility of a scheme encompassing the more relative areas of other apprenticeships in to one specifically for training of staff for the Hire Industry. This proposal could be part of the Additional Apprenticeship Incentive Scheme which has been introduced by the Minister of Labour to boost apprenticeship intakes. With intakes falling drastically in some trades (Carpentry was down 36% on the previous year ended March, 1977) the Commissioner of Apprenticeship, Mr. Michael Scott, has been predicting a serious shortage of skilled labour in years to come if this trend continues.

The story is the same nationwide. Employers report being swamped with dozens of applications for the one position. The Department suspects this has had a marked effect on the age and qualifications of young people entering the trades. With competition for apprenticeships high, employers can afford to be selective. In 1970 it was unusual for apprentices in most trades to have a School Certificate. Now, many apprentices have University Entrance.

The Department is conducting a survey of all apprentices taken on between November 1978 and March 1979 to ascertain their ages, educational qualifications and mobility, i.e. are they moving away

MARTIN'S NEW HIRE CENTRE OPENS IN GISBORNE, N.Z.

Everything from a cot to a compressor, a tap washer reducer to a trench excavator is available to either a home handyman or a commercial firm in the new premises of Martin's Hire Centre recently opened in Disraeli Street.

The new premises, which provide about twice the storage space of the previous ones which were in a different part of Disraeli Street, were needed because of the increasing demands for all types of specialist equipment, said the firm's owner, Mr. John Martin.

The new building provides just over 200 square metres of indoor storage space with office accommodation added to that. Designed by Gisborne draughtsman, Kevin Pyke, it was built by Martin and English.

John Martin went into the hire business about ten years ago. What originally started as a sideline developed into a major business.

BUILDER

Gisborne born and bred he started his working life with his father, Mr. Lorrie Martin, who was a well known local builder. Because of his background as a builder, John Martin says the firm is oriented towards that trade but has diversified because of the widespread demand.

Many tradesmen found it more convenient and economic to hire specialist equipment rather than buy it themselves and use it only occasionally.

"We get a better life out of plant because we service it ourselves. Everything has to be 100 percent when it goes out of here", said Mr. Martin.

"If a man hires a power float and has about half a dozen workers standing by and a mobile cement vehicle there he has to be sure that the machine will work. It is the same with everything we hire.

MAINTENANCE

"Maintaining our plant is essential, because in a business like this servicing is all the battle", he said.

There are two full time mechanics on the staff and Mr. Martin himself has learnt to become a jack-of-all-trades.

A walk through the premises shows that it would be hard to catch the firm out with anything a potential hirer might want.

There are compressors, pumps, welding and sanding equipment, the 20hp trench excavator, motor mowers, rotary hoes and a variety of other gear.

There are cots, push chairs, a caravan and trailers

available for those who may need them. The firm has a horse float, and even keeps two small boats for the occasional weekend fisherman.

"A hire firm has to have as wide a variety of gear available as possible," Mr. Martin said. "You could spend \$5000 on plant and it would go nowhere."

For the weekend painter there are trestles, ladders and spray equipment. There are even chairs and tables available to meet that sudden emergency.

The firm has two trucks available and will deliver if necessary.

"New Zealanders are still a nation of home handymen", Mr. Martin said, "and they usually look after the equipment when they take it. We always give them a run down on everything before it goes out."

"With our new centre we can meet more needs than ever, and that is what this business is all about, providing the best possible quality service for our customers", said Mr. Martin.

from home to take up their apprenticeship.

The Additional Apprentice Incentive Scheme is simple – a 30.00 per week subsidy on the wages of apprentices additional to those employed at 31st March last. The Scheme will provide positive assistance to employers during the most unproductive year of an apprentice's training. The details of the Scheme as announced by the Minister of Labour are as follows:

A subsidy of \$30.00 per week during the first year of employment for all qualifying apprentices engaged after 1/1/79.

Eligible apprentices will be additional to those employed at 31st March last. Where no apprentices were employed at 31st March last the employer will receive a subsidy for the first apprentice employed and every second apprentice thereafter.

The subsidy will replace any other Government subsidy paid for that apprentice (e.g. incentive payments for attendance at extended block courses).

The employer and apprentice will need to obtain the usual approval from the appropriate apprenticeship committee before employment commences.

The subsidy will be paid quarterly in arrears but where employment is terminated, the subsidy will not be paid for that quarter.

We are proceeding with caution as unseen problems could arise, such as which industrial award the apprentice would necessarily be under during training and the repercussions this could have on the Industry from Unions and the Labour Department.

However, a thorough investigation will be carried out by a special committee of the Association to iron out any problems before a scheme is instituted specifically for the Hire Industry.

As usual in the US, big is big.




