DITCH WITCH

# Particularly suited to the Hire Market.

Trenching machines can be popular and profitable items for the hire industry.

Compact handlebar machines can be rented by homeowners who have a backyard project to do on the weekend such as laying water lines or clipping a footing for flower-bed kerbing.

Larger machines can be rented by contractors for electrical or plumbing work and for a variety of other uses.

Over the years, the most popular hire/rental trencher has carried the name Ditch Witch.

Ditch Witch equipment is particularly suited to the hire market. Small Ditch Witch handlebar machines have been basic to the inventory of new rental stores. The Model 1810 is a relatively small riding trencher which has features found on larger equipment like four wheel drive and power steering. An optional backfill blade lets the 1810 fill up the trench, too. Larger trenches in the 18-HP-class to 30-HP-class are suited for contractor work.

Larger 30-HP-class to 65-HP-class equipment can do multiple underground jobs by using interchangable work modules, including front-mounted backhoes.

The full Ditch Witch line ranges from 7-HP-class to 100-HP-class.

Ditch Witch equipment is manufactured by The Charles Machine Works, Inc., Perry, Oklahoma. Ditch Witch's president, Edwin Malzahn, designed and built the world's first small trencher more than 30 years ago.

Malzahn was a recent engineering graduate working in the family's machine shop in Perry shortly after World War II. He was on a city street one day when he saw a large trencher being used to install a water main. It was sitting idle as a crew hand-dug service lines to houses. Curious why a machine wasn't being used, Malzahn discovered there was no compact trencher available for such work. He and his father decided to build one.

"I saw that first trencher," says Malzahn, "as being a tool for plumbers. I was thinking about the Perry plumber when we started to work." By 1948, they had a product they believed was ready to market. They displayed the machine at a "Made in Oklahoma" show held at the state fairgrounds. They began selling trenchers.

"I never did sell one to the Perry plumber, though," remembers Malzahn. "But he did borrow it a lot."

As business grew, manufacturing space of the machine shop was doubled from one metal building to two. A small brick office was added to the front. The company outgrew its quarters and a new plant and office were built west of the city. Expansions have been many and rapid ever since. Today's offices and plants cover about 821,000 square feet located on approximately 200 acres. The latest addition - art engineering center with offices and its own manufacturing and testing facilities - is about as large as the plant when the company moved to its present location.

Ditch Witch is a privately-held company and does not publish sales figures. However, 1980 United States Department of Commerce figures (fourth quarter estimated) show that in 1980 56 per cent of the total trenchers built in its size class were Ditch Witch units. The percentage of total units for 1979 was the same - 56 - an increase from 1978's 51.4 per cent.

The overseas market has continued to grow each year. Mole Engineering Pty. Ltd., with branches in all States, has been the Australian top dealer for over twenty-five years. In 1980, in fact, Mole Engineering was the top Ditch Witch dealer worldwide both in numbers of machines sold, and in dollar volume of sales. In Australia, Ditch Witch trenchers have long been a favourite machine with rental yards, as well as with plumbers, contractors and government departments throughout the land.

Plumbers . . . whom Ed Malzahn originally saw as his first customers . . . continue to remain an important segment of the Ditch Witch trencher market. But with the availability of equipment to make the installations, and improvement in materials, the trend in the past 20 years has been to put all utility lines underground. So the telephone and electric utilities . . . and the contractors that serve them . . . have become significant markets, along with electrical contractors, trenching contractors, rental business, cable television, water well drilling contractors . . . and the hire industry.

Ditch Witch was a pioneer in the development of the vibratory plow which is used to install material underground without trenching. Vibratory plow equipment is widely used in telephone and electrical installations and even for installing plastic pipe for underground sprinkler systems. Plowing - trenching without a trench — will become as popular in Australia as it is in the United States.

# Your Capital at work

A precis of a convention paper presented by Mr Jeffrey J Lucy, chartered accountant of Adelaide.

The decision whether to pay cash, borrow or lease not only varies between organisations but also within an individual organisation. The following matters must be considered; operators equity, the earning capacity of the item to be acquired, desirability of ownership taxation treatment, the effective interest rates, seasonal cash flow and the rate of absolescence. To illustrate the alternative methods of finance and the effect of each on a particular transaction the Australian Finance Conference has supplied an example to the three ways of finance of a \$100,000 item, namely by lease, cash purchase of hire purchases. I have made extracts from this for consideration.

### Schedule 1

Plant Cost: \$100,000

Depreciation: 20 percent pa prime cost

Taxation Rate: 46 percent pa paid

quarterly

Investment Allowance: 20 percent (\$20,000 in first year).

### The alternatives

Cash Purchase: \$100,000 paid at the beginning.

Lease: Term - 48 months. Monthly rentals - \$2538.

Residual value \$20,000 and acquired for this figure at the conclusion of the

Hire Purchase: Deposit - 20 percent (\$20,000) Interest rate - 9 percent flat. Term - 48 months. Monthly payments - \$2,266.67.

Timing of payments — 11 in year 1, 12 each in years 2, 3 and 4; one payment in year 5.

These examples are quite realistic regarding current interest charges.

### Cash Flow Before Tax

Applying these conditions, the pretax cash flow of the three alternatives are shown in Table 1.

Each alternative means different treatment as far as taxation is concerned

The amount of deduction for the Investment Allowance - \$20,000 - is common to all. Should the allowance not be available, it would not unduly affect the comparisons.

Depreciation applies to the cash and hire purchase alternatives in the first four years: \$20,000 per annum; and to the lease alternative on the purchase (20 percent on \$20,000 i.e. \$4000) from the fifth year.

Interest paid is a deduction in the hire purchase alternative (\$10,807, \$9,254, \$6,165, \$2,544 and \$30 in years 1 to 5 respectively.

Lease gives the tax deduction pattern shown in Table 2 i.e. amounts deductible in the comparisons accounts in arriving at assessable income.

At the 46 percent per annum tax rate these deductions represent reductions in the actual tax payable. Because tax is payable in the year after payment the cash benefit is shown in the year following deduction, as shown in Table 3.

Applying this benefit to the outgoings shown in Table 1 an "after tax cash flow" is derived as shown in Table 4.

The "cumulative after tax cash flow" can then be calculated as shown in Table 5.

Thus after six years, if the firm has leased and then later purchased the \$100,000 item, its net cash outflow has been \$74,744; with hire purchase it has paid out \$60,352; and with cash purchase, it has paid out \$44,800.

This conclusion however is not necessarily correct and a decision based on these bald totals can be misleading.

What is required is a year-by-year (or month-by-month, for that matter) consideration of the alternative cash flows.

In the first year, according to Table 5 the net outflows are \$100,000 (cash purchase), \$44,933 (hire purchase) and \$30,456 (lease). Thus, leasing has cash flow advantages in that year of \$69,544 and \$14,477 over cash purchase and hire purchase respectively.

Leasing figures are the base at zero and the variances from that favourable and unfavourable are shown above.

Table 6 disclosed the cash flow advantage (cash conserved) or disadvantage of leasing compared with the other alternatives over the six years.

By leasing therefore, the firm has been able to conserve its cash, especially in the earlier years and compared with cash purchase, the company which leases has an advantage for three years.

This introduces the first major point to be made in the investment decision that the cash conserved by leasing (assuming that the financing decision does in fact involve a choice, i.e. the firm can budget to pay cash, hire purchase or lease) is available to be invested income and earn elsewhere, internally or externally.

If, for example, the cash conserved is invested to return a cumulating 2.3 percent per month before tax (to give an overall 15 percent per annum after-tax return on investment) Table 7 shows the cumulated earnings after tax.

Consider month 1: Cash purchaser pays out \$100,000 while lessee pays out only \$2538. Cash conserved of \$97,462 is available to be invested to earn \$2258 (i.e. at 2.3 percent per month so as to yield 15 percent per annum after tax - not an unreasonable after-tax and before-inflation return for a business to aim for);

after month 2: Cash purchaser has still paid out \$100,000 while the lessee has now paid out a net \$2818 (rentals of \$5076 less \$2258 earnings) leaving cash conserved plus earnings of \$97,182 available to be invested to yield another \$2252 - and so on.

THUS, AT THE END OF FIVE YEARS, IF THE EQUIPMENT HAD BEEN LEASED RATHER THAN CASH PURCHASED, THE FIRM **COULD HAVE EARNED \$55.346** AFTER TAX BY INVESTING THE CASH CONSERVED THROUGH LEASING.

While it is not quite true to say that leasing has paid for itself, the \$55,346 return does compare favourably with the \$22,584 Year 5 cumulative cash disadvantage of leasing shown earlier.

In the example given, leasing has the advantage over both cash and hire purchase because it requires no initial cash outlay neither the full amount paid nor a deposit paid - and the cash difference can be invested elsewhere.



# Viewpoint

PETER LAWRENCE

### **30 DAYS HATH SEPTEMBER**

April, June and November.

3 months have passed and are you still waiting for that bill to be settled!

Debts are with every business in the country, town or city and nobody can avoid them. In the world of hire they can appear swiftly and also on a scale which can be greatly out of porportion with the object hired.

Some of these debts are actually started by the operations themselves through nealigence or greed. Their system of checking the equipment they have out on hire is too lengthy and in some cases dollar signs are flashing in front of their eyes as they allow certain hire dockets to remain in the files to fester.

"Yes he has hired before, he's OK." Overconfidence perhaps??

In the end the debt grows to a size where the hirer cannot pay it and the months roll by.

Policy on amounts or accounts can vary in their implementation by the different types of hire businesses but control must be kept if a lot of these debts are to be avoided.

The salient points on this one are at the start of the hire, and communication with your customer during the hire, once again it all starts at the counter.

Firstly you must get a phone number. Home, business or definite contact point. Preferably all of them. Secondly, the time out is required and the question must be asked. This too is noted on the hire docket.

Thirdly, the appropriate deposit is taken to cover that period (plus that contigency).

Now the control must start. A good man on the counter will check that hire dockets that are in operation every morning you are open for business. And if any are overdue they should be removed for checking.

Now comes the communication. Early morning is a good time to ring up one of those phone numbers your have on your hire docket and give your customer a friendly good morning.

Tell him who you are and ask the questions. Has he rung and extended his hire? There is no confirmation on his agreement. Perhaps it is running around the boot of his car from the weekend and he has inadertently forgotten it. Does he realise it is costing him X No. of dollars per day all the time he has the goods out?

Through this type of communication a lot of hires will be terminated and the customers will be very happy especially if they have really forgotten to return those goods and you have saved them money. They call that service and they will return to you and your

The hire operation may get an extra day's rental out of deal, at least it is paid and the goods back in the yard. For further hire, this is better for all and leads to a healthier climate in the business

We all find at times there are not enough hours in the day, but time must be set aside for this aspect of hire to keep the number of debts at a minimum, otherwise:




