

"I first of all acknowledge the giant step forward we took in management and financial control when the restructuring of the Company saw me as equal partners with Melbourne Sharebroker John Bailey and National Accountant Ian Sinclair — those who attended the Melbourne Convention and heard lan's Seminar on financing a hire business would appreciate what I mean.

My own knowledge of the Hire Industry in earlier years had been acquired through the friendly exchange of knowledge among members of the fledgling Hire Association of Victoria — Stan Jessup, Ray Kelsy, Peter Burne, Des Whelan and the Martin Bros. — we were all rookies learning together.

Coates Hire and Wreckair had emerged as large Companies but it

was the New South Welshmen who really led the way in the presentation of the Industry to the home ownerhandyman market. Fortunately they too were willing to freely pass on their knowledge at Interstate Conventions. etc. but I felt it was not until I attended the 1976 A.R.A. Convention in Houston Texas that I really got the true message about 'Image' - Come out from the back yard and show yourself - your building, your staff and of course, your equipment.

We have since spent a considerable amount of money remodelling our main Branch at Richmond, but coincidence or not, we have increased our new hires to at least 60 per day — with the new layout our staff are doing this easier than 40 hires in our old premises."

B.E. HIRE operate two other Bran-

At THOMASTOWN, in the industrial north of the city, a two acre centre handles the hire and maintenance of a large range of portable site offices and storage sheds as well as compaction equipment. This Branch has been operating for three years and its growth in the general range of contractor and home improver gear has been most satisfactory.

At DANDENONG, 35 kilometres to the south-east, a busy tradesman/ handyman operation with a staff of two and a driver handle in excess of 150 hires weekly. A good range of gardencare equipment has been built up its usage seems to have risen from a 3 month season to almost 9 months in this expanding residential district.

And at FOOTSCRAY they are currently constructing a twin drive-in under cover Centre due to open in November - "Twin" because this property has one frontage on Princes Highway and runs through to another very busy road - the approach and facilities from both entrances will be exactly the same.

The Company turnover is at present \$1.5 million.

The total staff of 27 includes two well known Hire Personalities:

Malcolm Sproat, who joined the Company ten years ago, is Manager and was recently appointed an Executive Director. He is only 32 years old, and according to Len, has all the qualifications to become a great "Hireman" with a sound knowledge of hire equipment, a good staff relationship and leadership and definitely not a 40 hour man.

Deputy Manager, Jack Parker was seen at his busy best during the Melbourne Convention — he handles all forms of Marketing for B.E.

Len and his wife Val, who rarely misses a Hire Industry Social function, have two daughters and a son and are proud grandparents.





When only the best will do

#### **PERQUISITES**

Here we have a heading with a definite French flavour and to the uninitated it could be the arrival of the latest perfume from the continent. But the external smell this one brings to mind crinkles a few noses and causes a problem of an internal nature.

The word abbreviated is PERKS which means, "a thing after serving its primary use is customarily taken pos-

session of by a servant"

What a wonderful position a hire operation has as far as "Perks" go. A complete storehouse of every useful thing one could wish for under one roof, and which would even make the local Santa Claus green with envy in its infinite variety.

Perks also need some management as it is an area that could get well out of hand if not properly controlled. If your operation is owner-managed and your wife is your only staff there is no problem and the perks are your own anyway, but if you employ staff and they wish to use some of your equipment a problem could evolve which would set your grey cells working to

There are five points which could control the "PERK" situation and they should be pointed out to a perspective employee at the commencement of his employment with your company. These points should also be listed out on the leading page of your staff equipment record book. This book is essential as one must not commit things that are lent to mind. If you forget, you've lost it, and you will never remember where it has gone because time would have gone too fast for you. Let us look at the five points concerning the control of the "PERKS".

1. The STAFF EQUIPMENT RE-CORD BOOK in which all items the members of the staff wish to borrow must be kept and filled in by a manager only. One cannot have the staff entering and checking the Ins and Outs of the equipment, as if an item of equipment goes missing there could be a red face somewhere. No item should be taken, and permission must be asked for and granted by the manager before its removal from the premises. If the item has a fleet number this should also be entered and the same item must be sighted by the manager on return.

2. The PREFERENCE POINT. As

we all know obviously the customer must come first, but this can depend on the quantity you have of that piece of equipment required and its popularity usage for the time of the year.

3. The TIME OUT as short as possible. Overnight or a Sunday if closed. Any longer a suggested rental of 50% of the rental value is a sug-

gested charge.

- 4. The PERKS AREA can be a very toothy part to control as there is an honesty factor involved. The "PERK" if allowed should be for STAFF MEMBERS ONLY. If you start lending to peole who are relative to your staff your gear could end up with the wife's cousin in Timbuktoo. Another grey area to keep an open eve on is the sudden appearance of "MATES". It is amazing how many friends appear when there is some nice useful gear to borrow, and your staff should be told you are aware of this and it is not on.
- 5. The CONSUMABLES that go with gear lent must be charged for of course and observation of the amount of consumables taken should be noted.

There is one BONUS and one ONUS in the points made that should be mentioned. The Bonus comes with the staff taking the gear home and becoming familiar with the use of it. His opinion of its workings is also worthy of note on its return. The Onus is on the manager himself also to put his name on the staff equipment book. because he too is human, and could also forget.

Perquisites like prostitution has been with civilisation for a very long time, and perfume of both can be lived with if handled correctly.





Record sales of \$1.3 million were recorded for the three days of the Convention . . . Just Fantastic.










