HIREWOMAN OF THE MONTH

Auckland based Hirepool - Home and Lei sure, New Zealand's largest party Hire operation, is managed by Beryl Butler.

Hirepool Home & Leisure is somewhat unusual in that it specialises in festivals and large functions. For example, at this year's Fletcher Marathon in Rotorua, one of the country's most popular and prestigious marathons, Hirepool despatched four articulated truckloads of equipment which included 35 beds as well as tables, chairs and blankets. This operation involved 7 staff.

For most functions Hirepool organises the total oper-

ation, including marquees, catering, bar staff etc.

Hirepool specialises in all forms of light (strobe, spot, flood, festoon, disco and black) and sound - they design and build their own 100 W disco units as well as their own 3 in 1 stereo units with 35W per channel. using 50W speakers. These have proved so popular and reliable that other companies are now buying them from Hirepool.

Hirepool also designs and builds its own folding tables

and has the largest stock of tables and chairs available in New Zealand. It also has crockery and cutlery to seat 2,500 people, prints its own cartons for its glasses, manufactures and designs its own barbeques, sells a great number of disposable plates, napkins, cutlery etc. and hires a wide range of products including medical equipment e.g. wheelchairs, health and exercise equipment, office equipment, camping equipment, household equipment, conference aids etc.

From her position as Assistant Secretary to Geoffery Clark, governing director of Construction Machinery Ltd., Beryl was promoted to Sole Charge Secretary at Hirepool in May 1981. Shortly after her appointment, the then manager went overseas for two months, and, as the assistant manager was ill for some of this time, Beryl was faced with the sole charge responsibility of running the operation as well as performing her own secretarial duties. As Beryl says, "I had to learn the hard way." When the manager returned from overseas, he too became ill. It was then that Beryl was officially appointed manager in February, 1982. Beryl says that she has worked all her life, doing secretarial work for various firms both before and after her marriage. She considers her secretarial background an advantage. as it enables her to think clearly as far as administration is concerned. Although she has no formal management training she

has worked alongside managers and this experience has enabled her to implement and improve the systems used in the various branches. After working her way up

through the ranks Beryl finds she now appreciates the staff's point of view while her experience as a youth leader in various activities helps in handling younger staff. Having often worked in a man's world, being a woman manager doesn't worry her, and her seven staff do form a good team, says Beryl.

Beryl's family have been very understanding she confides, as she works fairly long hours and is on 24 hour call. However she enjoys her job and looks forward to further developing the business, particularly the wedding market.

Beryl is happily married to Alan, a senior driving instructor with the A.A. Daughter Sue, aged 18, is an apprentice hairdresser and their 16 year old son, Greg, is sitting School Certicate this year.

Beryl likes a challenge. When faced with the task of finding her daughter an apprenticeship as a hairdresser, she and her husband mortgaged their house and bought a hairdressing salon.

It was in 1975 that Fletchers purchased Peter Brookfield and Eric Jarvies' Hirepool, a business which they had founded in 1955. Hirepool used the slogan "we hire almost anything", and did. They hired equipment as varied as teaspoons and road rollers. Fletcher's Hirepool was to become the largest hire organisation in New Zealand but in September 1980 Fletchers made the decision to withdraw from Hire. Some of the smaller yards were closed while the larger outlets were sold off. Of the seven branches in the greater Auckland area, six were purchased by Hirepool Auckland Ltd., a new company in which branch managers and staff held the shares.

The seventh, Hirepools Home and Leisure branch at 18 St. Marks Road, Newmarket was purchased by Construction Machinery. This branch had the distinction of being New Zealand's largest party hire operation.

Construction Machinery Ltd. had previous experience in the hire industry, already counting the largest portable Sanitation Company in New Zealand with branches in Auckland, Wellington and New Plymouth among its interests.

Despite the joint ownership of the Hirepool businesses in Auckland, the two continue to work closely together. They jointly promote the Hirepool image and the fact that party goods are available from all of the seven locations - each branch carries its own stock and displays.

However, all items that require washing and sterilising are collected from the branches each week in a 3 tonne Luton-bodied van. They are delivered to the Newmarket branch to be washed at their Health Department approved kitchen before being returned to the respective stores.









CUSTOMER INSTRUCTION: It's Worth Your Time

One of the focal points of the Equipment Rental Program at Western Iowa Tech is effective customer instruction.

Briefing customers can be handled with little or no instruction (imagine renting a chain saw to a first-time user without customer instruction), or it can be overdone.

Some rental people rely too

heavily on written instructions. Of course, forgetting information is no longer a concern using this technique, unless the customer forgets where he or she placed the instruction sheet. However, most people will not read the instructions

Also, written instructions can be very difficult to comprehend. Think of the times you have frantically tried to assemble one of your children's toys on Christmas Eve. Those instructions begin by stating that a 10-year-old can assemble the toy. Then the instructions continue: "Plug A into L; attach 7 in a lateral fashion to N while holding X and Z with your two forefingers." It is usually at this point that you refuse to read on and decide to "wing it."

Here are several guiding principles I use in instructing my students:

- 1. Don't insult the customer by using a patronizing voice.
- 2. Do not ask, "Do you know how to use one of these?" Instead ask, "Have you used this model before?" This allows the "know-it-all" to say he has used many, but not this model.
- 3. Be sure to give instructions in the order that you would use them. Don't start by telling them how to turn the unit off, or what to do while using the ma-

chine. Be logical and methodical.

- 4. Start by stressing safety.
- 5. Develop the habit of being thorough, even when other customers are waiting—they will appreciate the same good service. Rushing through an explanation may leave the customer more unsure of how to use your equipment than if no instructions were given.
- 6. After the initial explanation, repeat the instructions while demonstrating the unit. There are several exceptions to this rule. If the equipment is noisy, "dry-run" it.
- 7. Be sure to ask if your customer has any questions.
- 8. Quite often it is possible to tell by a person's face whether or not he or she really does understand how to correctly operate the unit. Repeat as many times as necessary.
- After the customer states that he or she understands, it is time to "test" the customer.
- 10. If practical for the type of equipment to be rented, have the customer demonstrate the unit to you. If the customer is going to have difficulty with the unit at the job site, he will have the same difficulty during your "tests."

If you use written instructions, be sure that the average person can understand them. Instruction sheets must deal with specific makes or models. If you give an instruction sheet to a customer (or student) at the start of your explanation, the customer will be looking at the sheet while you are talking. The customer's

thought is, "Why should I listen to this person when I have all I need on this paper?" The problem again is that most people won't read the instruction sheet. Therefore, don't even tell the customer that he or she will be receiving an instruction sheet until after you explain how to use the equipment.

What do you do about the "know-itall"? Perhaps this person really is an expert, or maybe he just doesn't want to admit he's never used this equipment before. Either way, you can say that it is store policy to instruct everyone. That way you've done your best to make sure the customer is well-informed, and you haven't embarrassed anyone.

The customer retains (remembers) information longer if the teacher (you or your staff) combines more than one sense in the preparation.

As you can see from the chart, short-term recall is facilitated by the combination of telling and showing. In certain rental applications (where the customer will not be using the equipment for a few days, for example), the combination method of instruction is by far the best. Remember this chart when you break in a new employee.

Sounds time-consuming? Believe me, it is worth it. You will be making fewer service calls. Your equipment will require less repair. Most importantly, your customer will receive the satisfaction of getting the job done correctly the first time. This is the source of your most effective advertising.







QUIETER 'JACKHAMMERS'

Paving breaker ("jackhammer") noise is one of the most irritating – and potentially dangerous – threats to the public, and breaker operators. For this reason State Government authorities in recent years, have – through legislation – increased pressures on manufacturers to silence their machines. Atlas Copco, a pioneer in the field, introduced polyurethane jacketed machines in the early 1970's as a complement to its range of super-silenced portable compressors.

The Tex-series, silenced units were proven in Sydney City Council tests to be 50% quieter than the traditional unsilenced "Jackhammer". Now the N.S.W. Government is drawing up a new code fixing new noise limitations for this equipment. LET'S TALK HIRE . . SERIOUSLY

One of the major industries within Australia today, the general and specialized Hire Industry, has within its fractured and multi-faceted groups, an economic situation of major proportions, which is affecting the very economy and well being of a number of its members.

The economic growth of Hire, has naturally been curtailed by the difficult down turns in industry generally, and the whole economic climate within Australia at this present

Because of the massive growth in the industry over the past few years, Hire has found itself in a position of static surprise, yet a blind man could have seen its future processes and the eventual consequences. It had only one way to go.

Industrial firms seeking "Cash Flow", have readily bought into Hire, much to the detriment of many firms, now foundering in a discount bog.

Up until a few years ago, it was the goose laying golden eggs, but circumstances have certainly changed its image in many areas.

beyond the boundary of their own domain, yet many are feeling the pinch. Everything is now pointing to further down turns, therefore it is inevitable that a change must occur, in methods. ideas, sales, marketing, with a new approach to honest price

structures, and discounting.

If this doesn't come about,

wholesale devastation of

the indistry will result, and

firms will proceed to the

wall, in ever increasing

Few proprietors ever look

numbers, as their cash flow diminishes. This will leave the field to the economically able, who, in many cases, are part and parcel to financial schemes and takeovers. and who regulate their cash flow to this end.

A monopolistic trend, which, if things continue as they are, will see the major proportion of small hire firms completely eliminated from the scene.

The realities of hire's financial world should have shown all "hire identities", by now, how bad the situation really is, but it seems that a head in the sand attitude prevails.

It is a fact that there is a significant attitude amongst certain large firms who have strong positions nationally, to finance project contractors to the limit of discount dealings. To compete, the smaller firms have accepted the challenge with often dire results. This is a known fact right throughout the industry, but never seems to get aired. Why?

These ills were caused within the industry, and by good doctoring could be cured.

A "Select Committee" of the industry as a whole, must review the total processes.

A "Hire Industrial Society" type of committee was mooted, but the very powers within the H.A.A. itself were, and are, its natural enemy.

As the hire industry contracts upon itself, many, many persons will lose their business or their jobs, which, is the evil of the whole setup.

Many outside firms who attempted to exploit the "hire boom" as they called it these few years back, have already gone to the wall.

When "HIRE AS A BUSI-NESS" was recommended in P.E.A. AUGUST 1980, I criticised the article at the time, as I saw then that the opening of new hire outlets in all areas where hire was well catered for, would eventually create many problems, but this is not the real sickness within the industry. The sickness is the self made, self destructing discount systems which are literally taking away millions of dollars from hire income generally.


This topic seems to raise more interest among hire employees in the areas of management and sales than hire owners. Why? The hire owners have certainly the monopoly of say so, but don't seem interested in getting down to the nitty gritty of the problem.

It is typical with any industry or Financial group that there is no market for pessimism, and very little interest in criticism. The desire to remain unchanged and unfeeling is the outward show of indignation without voice, which is always typical of a free capitalistic enterprise.

Anyone who tends to think they know all about the machinations of hire, will realize the similarities between down turns in hire and the Australian industrial and economic set backs. Therefore it is inevitable that as certain hire firms feel the pinch, they in their very endeavours to keep afloat, make it so hard for other established firms.

This is the whole crux of my efforts to show and try to explain the dangers.

The loss of any firm, with its attendant tragedy of unemployment, is fundamental to any thinking, and are items of great importance for the hire industry as a whole.

SABOTAGE CLAIM FROM HIRE FIRMS

A \$5000 reward is being offered by a group of Sydneybased hire companies in an attempt to end what they believe is a campaign of industrial sabotage.

five companies, Kennards High Reach, Travel Towers Australia, Ace Hi Lift, Decor and Corrosion and Instant Scaffolds specialise in hiring out lifting equipment for building projects.

A wave of industrial vandalism in Sydney's southern and western suburbs over the past three months is estimated to have cost more than \$4 million.

It was reported in the Melbourne Herald that the spokesman for the group, Mr. Neville Kennard, said that there was no doubt that the attacks were part of a "planned campaign of industrial sabotage."

"In 30 years in the hire industry, this is the first time I have seen anything like this," he said.

"Whoever is responsible for these attacks has an inside knowledge of the equipment and the industry and knows how to cause maximum damage," he said.

The companies say that about \$50,000 worth of damage has been done to sophisticated lifting and industrial equipment over the past few months.

In one recent incident sand and acid were poured into a hydraulic tank. In another, heavy industrial engines had been started after the engine oil has been taken out.

Mr. Arthur Squires, the managing director of Decor and Corrosion, said yesterday that burglaries and break-ins had also taken place in the past five weeks.

"I believe that what is happening is straight industrial sabotage. This is not just vandalism," Mr. Squires said.

However, there was no indication that any of the other companies in the industry were involved.

KEROSINE SPACE **HEATERS**

The Standards Association of Australia has published a standard dealing with kerosine space heaters which includes a requirement that they be self-extinguishing when overturned.

AS 2510 was requested by the Department of Consumer Affairs, NSW, because existing regulations in the State were based on a British Standard which is now out of date. The Department also wanted to have an Australian Standard to call up in the revision of its kerosine heater regulations.

A major feature of this standard is a requirement that heaters be automatically self-extinguishing overturned. Limits are also set with regard to the levels of combustion products (CO/CO₂) produced by the heater.

Performance of the heater in a draught is subject to the requirement that the flame does not become unstable or increase in size. and the heater should not produce smoke.

INCOME TAX GUIDE AMENDMENT FOR MOTOR VEHICLE EXPENSES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 1982

The Taxation Office recently announced that the income tax guides issued to assist taxpayers in completing their returns for income received during the year ended 30 June 1982 provided incorrect details of the rates per kilometre to be used in the calculation of a deduction for motor vehicle expenses.

The income tax guide should read:

"Where the total kilometres for business purposes did not exceed 10,000 for the year, you can either provide details of expenses claimed or make your claim at a set rate per kilometre based on the engine capacity of your vehicle. The rates are 15.5 cents for engines up to 1500c.c., 17.4 cents for 1501c.c. to 2000c.c., 20.6

cents for 2001 to 4000 and 23.7 cents for over 4000c.c. engines."

"Where the total kilometres for business purposes did not exceed 10,000 for the year, you can either provide details of expenses claimed or make your claim at a set rate per kilometre based on the engine capacity of your vehicle. The rates are 15.5 cents for engines up to 1500c.c., 17.4 cents for 1501 c.c. to 2000c.c., 20.6 cents for 2001 to 4000 and 23.7 cents for over 4000c.c. engines."

Taxpayers whose 1981/82 returns are lodged on the basis of the rates set out in the income guides may seek amendments on the basis of the higher rates shown in this statement.






