

MAN OF THE MONTH

If it wasn't for BP's exclusive use of the phase "The Quiet Achiever", Leigh could easily fall into this category. He has been in the scaffolding hire business for the past twenty (20) years, commencing with G.K.N. in Brisbane, Queensland, where he quickly learned the ground rules for hiring and contracting scaffolding, formwork, etc. During the seven (7) years he spent in Brisbane, Leigh obtained his scaffolding licence and a dip-Ioma in Building and Construction at college, so that he could more easily relate to the problems and the needs of the customers he was dealing with on a day to day

In 1970 Leigh moved to the U.K. still with G.K.N., with a view to extending his knowledge of scaffolding, access equipment and the hire industry in general. His intention was to stay one year but was talked into staying for nine years. One reason for this,

was an English girl by the name of Trina who happened to attend an "in-house" barbecue where Leigh was living in London. As a result of this "gathering", marriage took place in 1973 and now two English/Australian daughters — Victoria and Aimee, control their lives.

One particular reason for staying in the U.K. was Leigh's acceptance of an offer to manage the G.K.N. branch in Leicester. Then, as a result of this success he was transferred from branch to branch, as manager, for four years to turn non-profit branches into organised and profitable ones. Leigh feels the experience and knowledge gained during this period was excellent. In the main he:

- Set up new operating procedures.
- Established staff motivational programs.
- Developed the theme "do the job right and only do it once" in each organisation.

All branches Leigh was associated with, responded accordingly and returned, at least, to normal, profitable trading.

In 1975 another national scaffolding company, Stephens & Carter offered Leigh a senior management position, which he accepted. This new position exposed Leigh to a different style of management and a broader range of products including: aluminium mobile towers, swinging stages, etc. In 1979 Leigh turned down a further promotion to return to Australia.,

It appeared, Leigh reflects, that after nine years "it was time I went home."

Upon is arrival in Australia, Leigh was immediately "grabbed" by Instant Scaffolds for his vast knowledge and experience of the scaffolding industry. As N.S.W. Sales Manager Leigh could see the tremendous potential for both the company and himself. Leigh's faith in his decision was justified, as twelve months later the General Manager. Martin Wallis resigned after 11 years service to turn his hand to farming. Martin had guided the company from a backyard business to a thriving multi-million dollar organisation. The position of General Manager was offered to Leigh who welcomed such a challenge. Not only did Instant Scaffolds have a world wide proven product line but the people were very enthusiastic and experienced and the company had a speial chemistry about it, bubling with energy.

During the past three years as General manager Leigh has transformed this small thriving company into an efficient, organised, profitable organisation by acquisition and product diversification. Some of his achievements include:

- The establishment of a corporate image and corporate policies.
- A second branch in Sydney.
- A new branch in Darwin, N.T.
- The acquisition of another scaffolding company in Queensland.
- The establishment of agents in N.Z.
- Complete product diversification, i.e., from aluminium mobile towers to scissor lifts, vertical man lifts, independent scaffolding, swinging stages, etc.
- The acquisition of a "general hire" company in Sydney.

- (d) self-propelled mobile towers that are driven from the platform;
- (e) a wider range of vertical lifts;
- swinging stages with electric and air winches with twin suspension cables;
- (g) power to platform on scissor lifts;
- (h) spandeck staging with span's up to 7.2m;
- (i) our own engineer to do all design work;
- our own factory to manufacture all specials, stage platforms and framing.

The recent acquisition of Warringah Hire, soon to be named "Instant Hire" is the first of many general hire outlets to be established throughout Australia. Instant Scaffolds, now a truly national company, have successfully maintained a large market share of aluminium scaffolding despite fierce competition from other national scaffold companies.

Being the pioneer of aluminium scaffolding and scissor lifts in Australia, has meant constant pressure on Instant Scaffolds and its people, and Leigh is the first to admit that the success of the company is due to its depth of human resources, who at all levels are very loyal and dedi-

Despite every-increasing vehicle owning and operating costs, it now takes only 41 weeks to earn enough money (after tax) to buy a new car — compared with 85 weeks in 1952.

On the other hand, to pay for car registration and third party insurance in 1982 requires 36 hours work against only 29 hours 30 years ago. In fact, of 12 examples of goods and services, registration and compulsory insurance is the only item which has increased in cost more rapidly than earnings since 1952.

The comparison was compiled by the Institute of Public Affairs. The figures also show that, while average weekly earnings in 1982 are 10 times those of 1952, the amount of tax paid on average earnings is now 17 times higher!

Dear Sir.

Under the terms of the Construction Safety Act 1971-1982, persons operating hoisting appliances are required to hold a Hoist Driver's Certificate. Boom lifts, scissor lifts and other similar appliances come within the definition of a "hoisting Appliance" as set out in the Act.

To obtain a Hoist Driver's Certificate, it is first necessary for a person to take out a learner's permit which is valid for a period of three months. During this period, the person can obtain his forty (40) hours experience which is one of the requirements necessary for a Certificate of Competency as a Hoist Driver.

On obtaining his forty (40) hours experience, the person can then make application for his Certificate. It is necessary that the person receive his training under the supervision of a certificated hoist driver.


The use of boom lifts, scissor lifts and other similar appliances are being used more frequently on construction sites and it is realised that difficulties may be experienced by some of your clients in having a certificated person in their employment to operate these hoisting appliances. To overcome this problem, the following procedures can be adopted to facilitate the use of these appliances.

Please note that these procedures are to be adopted only in the case where your client does not have a certificated operator to operate the hoist.

(a) It is necessary that the person from your firm giving instructions in the operation and use of these appliances leading to a Permit to fulfil, hold a Hoist Driver's Certificate.

#### (b) Procedure to Obtain a Permit to Fulfil

- The representative of the firm hiring the hoisting appliance is to give the workman who is to use the appliance thorough instruction in the operation, use and safety features and procedures of the appliance. It is expected that this could take up to four (4) hours on some appliances.
- 2. Upon the representative being satisfied that the workman can operate the appliance in a safe and satisfactory manner, he is to give to the employer of the workman a letter, on company headed letter paper, stating that the workman (name and address to be inserted) has been trained and is proficient in the operation and use of the appliance.
- The letter, together with the application for the permit to fulfil and the fee is to be forwarded to this Division by the employer of the workman.
- When the workman has had his forty (40) hours experience, he can then make application for his Certificate in the usual manner.
- (c) If your client has a certificated operator, it is the responsibility of your client to train other persons by using the learner's permit system. It is possible to have up to four (4) persons who hold learners' permits to be trained by one certificated holder.



Please note that any violations of the above procedures could cause the non-recognition of your firm's training. This means that any of your clients using a hoisting appliance without a certificated operator would be stopped from using the appliance.

Copies of the various forms are enclosed and further supplies or queries you may have can be directed to the nearest office of the Inspector of Construction Work.

As our industry grows we generate a need for additional skilled staff within the industry.


But from what source do we acquire these people?


Our current practice of "buying" staff from within the industry is in itself a short term solution to the problem. What we need is a long term programme aimed at providing our skilled labour needs.






The Standards Association of Australia has published a new edition of its standard for the certification of welders and welding supervisors.

AS 1796 has been revised at the request of DLI's in all States to meet present day educational requirements.

This standard sets out the requirements necessary for the granting of certificates to people engaged in the operation of various welding processes used in the manufacture of boilers, pressure vessels and other special applications requiring a prescribed standard in the theory and practice of welding. It also provides for uniformity of examinations across Australia.

This new edition simplifies the pre-examination requirements for a candidate; includes an illustrated table to assist in the visual examination; and extends the number of certificates a welder may hold without further examination or tests. The opportunity has also been taken to clarify the requirements and to change the format to facilitate information retrieval.



#### **NSW EMPLOYMENT PROTECTION ACT 1982**

The MTIA has initiated proceedings in the High Court of Australia seeking a declaration that the NSW Employment Protection Act, a State Act, does not apply to employees working under the Federal Metal Industry Award.

Members involved in terminating employment in NSW are reminded that they should file appropriate notices pending the outcome of the case. The Association recommended that notices should include a statement in the following terms:

This notice relates to an employee employed under a

Federal Award and it is contended that the Employment Protection Act 1982 accordingly does not apply to this employee. This notice is lodged without prejudice to such position and without any admission that the termination of this employee's services are within the jurisdiction of such Act.

This standard specifies requirements for the construction of freezer test packages intended for use in the determination of performance of frozen food retail cabinets (AS 1731), and any freezer compartment of household refrigerators (AS 1430), or similar appliances. Three alternative types are given, but one is preferred, and the standard encourages the phasing out of the old stocks of the alternatives.

According to the restaurant one particular blackout last year caused a 30% fall-off in trade. Another nine McDonald's franchise operators have taken delivery of Lincoln Electric Dis-gen 31 kVA generators to ensure "business as usual" during anticipated blackouts.

#### YOUR EYE AND SPEEDS

Almost all of the information needed for riding a motor cycle is obtained through the eyes.

Ability to see moving objects or ability to see something while you are moving, is called "dynamic sight". On the other hand, eyesight as rated by the test of visual power is defined as "static sight". Generally speaking, dynamic sight is poorer than static sight. The higher speed decreases the ability of dynamic sight.

Thus, while riding, either you or the objects you see, or in some cases both, are moving, thereby reducing visual power.

Visual power changes all the time.


Visual power can not be kept constant, it varies under different conditions (becomes poorer).

- (a) Fatigue
  Staying up late prevents
  eyes from recovering
  smoothly from fatigue.
  In this case eyes are
  kept in a condition of
  chronic fatigue.
- (b) Physical conditions If something is wrong with your health, it will directly affect your eyes.
- (c) Visual power begins to lessen when one passes the age of 40.

#### Speed and ability to see

Relationship between increasing speed and decreasing

ability to discern moving objects.



Increasing speed narrows range of vision.

One's range of vision covers approx. 200 degrees when he is at a standstill. The range of vision begins to become narrower when moving speed exceeds 40 km/h. Increasing speed narrows the rider's field of vision. Therefore, while running at high speeds, you will feel as if you were looking ahead through a pipe. That is to say, you will feel it harder to see the objects around you and only a point far ahead, on which your eyes rest, will become clear.

While running at speeds under 60 km/h, you must set your eyes on the point at a distance three times the reading on the speedometer. In case speeds exceed 70 km/h, the distance should be 4-5 times the reading. For example, when you ride a bike at the speed of 60 km/h, the said distance should be 180 metres.



#### SPEED AND DRIVER'S FIELD OF VISION

100 km/h...40°



As speed increases, the rider's field of vision becomes narrowed.

Since its introduction as a "tree felling machine" in the mid-twenties, the chainsaw has been generally accepted as a very useful, portable wood-cutting machine.

However, despite the usefulness and versatility of chainsaws, there are some lesser appreciated and disturbing accident conditions created, which are directly related to the use of this type of tool.

Whilst true accident statistics are not readily available, it is a fact that a trail of injuries to operators of chainsaws, some very serious or fatal, has followed the successful sales of increasing numbers of chainsaws. A number of surveys have been carried out in the U.S.A. and some European countries of chainsaw manufacture and the applicable safety regulations available to the consumer. In a number of instances this led to the introduction of new safety regulations and the undertaking of the development of appropriate safety standards.

Chainsaws, by their nature, have certain inherent features, which could affect the health and physical well-being of their operators, although the nature of the work being carried out also contributes.

One particular alarming feature of the chainsaw is its ability to "kick-back". Kick-back is one of the most common causes of chainsaw accidents. It occurs when the moving saw chain on the top of the guidebar, or above the centreline of the guidebar nose, makes contact with an object. This creates a sudden rapid upward and backward motion of the chainsaw, which is caused by the interference with the high speed of the sawchain and the high energy system and results in an abnormally rapid transfer of energy into a rotation of the entire chainsaw, creating immediate thrustback of the guidebar nose. Serious accidents can result from physical contact by the operator with the uncontrolled moving saw chain. However, counter measures can be taken to reduce the incidence of kick-back by the fitting of a handguard which prevents slipping of the hands into the moving chain and by incorporating a chain-brake which stops the motion of the chain during a kickback. Further improvements, such as the re-designing of the guidebar and saw chain contribute to solving part of the problem.

Prolonged operation of chainsaws can, owing to their inherent vibrations, produce the loss of feeling in hands or arms. Rapid vibrations can cause problems such as the so-called Raynaud's Phenomenon where fingers become white or blue, number or powerless. This is a particular problem with all vibrating tools including chainsaws and is aggravated by cold weather. Conditions of

## A godsend or a potential occupational hazard?

vibrations vary with the type of timber cut, e.g. hardwood or softwood and may be more of a problem to people prone to Raynaud's Phenomenon. Appropriate balancing of the various moving parts, the incorporation of anti-vibration handle mountings and heating and handles are some of the latest improvements. It helps when gloves are worn. Chainsaws, and in particular the petrol driven types, also generate noise levels which could interfere with the operator's hearing ability and a risk of permanent damage to hearing is likely if hearing protection is not used. Everyone perceives sound differently. A sound which may seem extremely loud to one person may appear to be only mildly irritating to another. Intensity levels measured in decibels provide for some of the indicators for the determination of exposure levels. However, as with vibration, the length of the exposure period is extremely important.

Generally it can be said that above 100 decibels, the noise level produced is decidely too high for uprotected hearing.

The noise level output of newly manufactured chainsaws receives constant attention and serious attempts are being made to reduce the output to safer levels. Currently produced chainsaws have noise levels of between 100 and 130 decibels and this highlights the fact that hearing protection is a necessity.

In conclusion it can be said that as a tool a chainsaw is a godsent piece of equipment, but continuing attempts must be made to avoid it becoming an occupational hazard and the foremost consideration must be the incorporation of appropriate safety features. Last but not least, operator education and training in the use of the chainsaw are essential.
