A Revolution for the Hire Industry

An insurance plan especially designed for the industry at a price that won't hurt.

There's nothing new about people uniting for the common good. Indeed that's the basic concept behind associations and the insurance industry. Nor is there anything new about association endorsed insurance programs – they've existed for decades.

What is relatively new is an association forming their own insurance brokerage and that's what your association has now done!

History has been that members have found that getting the right cover has been either complicated or downright impossible. Let's face it, the insurance industry just didn't want to know you. Covers were either inappropriate or at a cost that took a sizeable chunk out of the pie. On an individual basis members do not have any great buying power but combined they are in a position of strength to negotiate far more favourable terms.

It is difficult to properly insure a hire operation from an insurance companies point of view. There are several problem areas. One is a special coverage is required to cover not only hire stocks while on the owner's premises but also anywhere in Australia whilst in the hirer's possession and during which time the owner has little or no control over his property. Another is the theft by hirer risk which is an area which insurers traditionally regard as "the cost of doing business". Then there are problems getting storm cover for marquees, burglary cover in a locked yard and insurers are afraid of the enormous exposures in the liability area. These were some of the major problems we had to solve and solve them we did!

A feasibility study was conducted to determine the insurance needs and claims experience of members. One member, in response to the survey, summed it up when he said, "I feel that the prices I am currently paying do not reflect the total lack of claims over the years I have conducted the hire business. Much of my plant is insured under inappropriate cover as no policy exists for the type of cover I require, e.g. all individual items with a value over \$1,000 are covered by a fleet motor vehicle policy when off the premises. This is not appropriate for concrete saws, rotary hoes, etc. and I am pleased that I have not had to test the extent that this

cover offers. I would hope that a separate rate structure would be devised for country operators and I'd prefer a rate based on a choice of low premiums and higher excess. Some of my existing policies overlap as no one policy covers all my requirements.

As a result of an excellent response to the survey, we were able to design a package that would meet the needs of the majority of the membership. Should the program not meet any specific requirements of an operation, we can modify the terms or tailor a "one-off" cover.

The Association Executive wanted a program that would specifically fit the hire industry, one that would take into consideration all of the risks – a comprehensive insurance for a diverse market. "We were not looking for the most inexpensive program, but one that suited the needs", said Brian Elms, President 1983-84 for Victorian Region. However, members will be pleased at the cost saving advantages that were achieved.

The policy covers and the exclusions have been specially designed to comply with that essential document of your business – the hire contract.

The establishment of the brokerage, which is owned by the Association, was a most positive step. Ignorance of hire operations was one flaw in the insurance industry but now Hire and Rental Insurance Brokerage Pty. Ltd. (HARIB) with offices established in all States, can offer protection for needs that are understood.

The program is only available to financial members of the Hire and Rental Association of Australia and insuring members have the option of purchasing a share at \$10.00. 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Unleaded Petrol

Answers to questions most frequently being asked



Unleaded petrol will be introduced to Australia in July this year, and already there are many questions being asked about it. To answer them, the Australian Institute of Petroleum Ltd. produced a leaflet, which we have reprinted, for the benefit of hirers who operate petrol-engined equipment.

Why introduce a new grade of petrol?

Unleaded petrol (ULP) is needed because Federal and State governments have decided that all new petrol-engined cars, station wagons, panel vans and utilities manufactured on or after 1 January 1986 must be designed to run on that fuel.

(In New South Wales, the regulation extends to all other petrol-engined vehicles, including trucks and motor cycles. Elsewhere, that applies from 1 March 1988 for motor cycles and from 1 July 1988 for trucks. The NSW and Victorian regulations also cover late 1985-model vehicles designed and recommended by the manufacturer for use only with unleaded petrol.)

The main reason for this decision is to improve air quality in major cities, by reducing the amount of certain gases (carbon monoxide and hydrocarbons) in vehicle exhausts. Unleaded petrol is needed because catalyst technology will be used to achieve the required reduction in emission levels. Regulations specifying the new, lower emission limits apply to new cars from 1 January 1986.

Another reason for introducing unleaded petrol is to reduce emissions of lead compounds from vehicle exhausts.

When will unleaded petrol be available?

It is a government requirement that unleaded petrol be available to the public nationally from 1 July 1985, and it will begin to appear at service stations from April 1985 onward.

What will happen to super grade and standard grade petrol?

Super petrol will continue to be available nationally for many years, alongside the new unleaded petrol grade.

Standard petrol will go off the market when unleaded petrol is introduced. The storage, distribution and retail dispensing facilities now used for standard petrol will be cleaned out and switched over to unleaded petrol.

Will existing vehicles be able to use unleaded petrol?

Many certainly will. It is expected that there will be plenty of publicity about which makes and models can run on unleaded petrol. Owners and drivers of these cars will be encouraged to switch to the new fuel.

However, most pre-1986 model vehicles will need to continue to operate on super petrol.

All motorists, including those who currently use standard petrol, should watch for – or seek – advice from vehicle manufacturers or motorists' organisation on whether or not to run their present vehicles on unleaded petrol.

How will unleaded petrol differ from today's petrol?

It will be pale yellow in colour to distinguish it from the red-coloured super grade, and it will have an octane rating between those of super and standard.

The decision by Federal and State governments that unleaded petrol of 92 octane should be introduced was based on a study which recognised the desirability of keeping costs down and of conserving oil. To make unleaded petrol of 97 octane would mean using significantly more crude oil in refineries, thereby raising costs. Government authorities determined the optimum octane rating for Australian unleaded petrol as 92, and engines of 1986 model vehicles will have compression ratios to match that octane rating.

How will cars differ after 1985?

From 1 January 1986 new cars must comply with more stingent exhaust emission standards, and most manufacturers will meet the new standards by fitting catalytic converters to exhaust systems. (Naturally, pre-1986 model vehicles which are switched over to unleaded petrol operation will not need to have catalytic converters fitted to them.)

Catalytic converters change most of the carbon monoxide and hydrocarbons in engine exhausts into carbon dioxide and water vapour. They are intended to last the life of the vehicle and should need no maintenance. However, catalytic converters would be rendered ineffective by lead compounds in petrol; therefore, it will be an offence to use leaded petrol in a car designed for unleaded petrol.

The new generation of cars will carry UNLEADED PETROL ONLY labels near petrol caps, and will have narrow fill pipes—too narrow to receive the nozzles on leaded petrol pump hoses.

How will motorists know that unleaded petrol is available?

From early in 1985 there will be a good deal of publicity about the advent of unleaded petrol in the middle of the year.

The first 1986 model vehicles, designed to run on unleaded petrol, are likely to be released in the second half of 1985. Their narrow fill pipes, labels near petrol caps (and elsewhere) and vehicle operator manuals will all indicate unleaded petrol requirements.

Service station pumps for unleaded petrol will be clearly designated and will have the new, narrow nozzles fitted to their hoses.

Will there be much risk of cars being 'misfuelled' at service stations?

To prevent 'misfuelling' of 1986 model and later cars, their fill pipes will take only the new, smaller nozzles to be fitted compulsorily and exclusively to unleaded petrol dispensing pumps.

Any attempt to put leaded petrol into such a car will be not only illegal but also dangerous – because fuel is certain to spurt back and spill.

Although it will be physically possible to serve unleaded petrol into a vehicle that should have super, pump labelling should make such an error extremely unlikely. If an error does happen, a top-up with super as soon as possible is advisable because the lower octane rating of unleaded petrol could cause harmful engine-knock ('pinging').

What will be the effect on vehicle fuel consumption?

In existing cars, if they can run satisfactorily on unleaded petrol and if they are switched over to that grade, there will be no change in fuel consumption.

It is not possible to generalise about how 1986 model cars will compare with current vehicles in fuel consumption because there will probably be so much variation between different makes and models. Overall, fuel consumption is unlikely to differ much from current levels.

What about farmers and industrial consumers who don't buy petrol through service stations?

They will need to have access to unleaded petrol as soon as they acquire 1986 model or later vehicles, because it will be legally compulsory and probably a vehicle warranty requirement to use only unleaded petrol in the new models designed to run on that fuel.

Complete segregation of unleaded petrol from leaded petrol, as at service stations, will be essential.

These direct buyers should consult with their petrol suppliers to make the most efficient supply, storage and dispensing arrangements.

What fuel should be used in petrol generators, motor mowers, chain saws, etc.?

Manufacturers will be issuing advice in relation to both new engines and those now operated on standard petrol. Many engines will be able to use unleaded petrol, but others will need super grade.

The important thing is to follow the maker's recommendation.

The Standards Association of Australia has published a new edition of the standard dealing with safety aspects of children's cots.

AS 2172, Cots for Household Use (Safety Requirements) was prepared in order to expand the scope of the previous edition to include costs which do not have dropsides as well as to review some of the design requirements.

The standard is intended to provide guidelines for manufacturers and purchasers so that potentially hazardous features of cot design and construction can be avoided.

The standard specifies dimensions, materials, construction and assembly, and requirements for accessories where these relate to the safe use of a cot. Strength and durability are established by performance tests. Information to be supplied to the purchaser regarding assembly, maintenance and selection of a suitable mattress is also specified.

ADVERTISING HOW MUCH TO INVEST?

This question must be asked many times of the professional agency or 'in company' publicity department, or the owner-operator to his wife, or partner etc..

There is no concise answer, for each hire operation is different, governed by location, resources of the outlet and other factors which revolve around the term demographics.

Budgeting

An advertising budget must be established by any hire company — a budget being a plan for the present and future operations. It must be compatible with hire income and provide a means of control over your operation, but it cannot remain too rigid, cannot be unalterable, and should contain a contingency fund for the unexpected advertising opportunities which may arise. Administering the budget is more or less routine but planning and carrying out the budget is most important.

What on?

What do we spend our budget on? This has to be decided at the same time a budget is prepared — the obvious choices being, direct mail literature; newspapers; radio, TV; institutional i.e. club programmes, notice boards, etc.; telephone directories, hoardings, buses, novelty giveaways, shop signs and posters; price lists, cinema, sponsorship, public relations exercises; and sales representatives.

In calculating the money you need for advertising you need to identify who it will be aimed at — tradespeople, D.I.Y./Homeowners, new customers, past customers. And what about promoting your business to your existing customers?

'Special' Features

A word of warning — don't let the advertising representatives plan your budget for you — you give them a figure, they'll try and stretch it a little, quote them the number of ads. you want per week or month, they'll offer you an alternative 'which will give you better coverage . . . and only costs another \$X'. Another favourite tack is we are doing a special feature on the hire industry, all your competitors will be taking space, how much will you want?!!' This can double any existing budget you may have carefully calculated. One of our local papers has scheduled a 'Hire Feature' every three to four weeks throughout the year!

Common Sense

The philosophy of not cutting advertising expenditure to improve profits always remains solid common sense. If you budget for \$X000 at the beginning of the year — spend it! If business drops, advertising is the easiest place to cut and it is the hardest place to prove you are wrong. If your plan was good at the beginning of the year it is good all the way through.

Many hire people I am sure do not work out an effective advertising programme, instead they advertise as the spirit moves them (or as the Americans put it the SWAG method — Scientific Wild Ass Guessing), or when they feel they "have to because things are down" or "when it can be afforded". This is too haphazard and more preferable is a logically planned advertising budget which is used effectively to give you more coverage and bring in prospects at a lower cost.

P.R. — 'Free' Advertising

To diverse slightly many of us forget the value of 'free advertising' which we need not budget for — a medium which insufficient hire companies use — I mean of course newspaper articles, radio and television news spots. Many hire companies are selfish in this respect, they think the media will not use material if it is blatant advertising and therefore they are not prepared to re-phrase the article or material so that it can be used to the benefit of the hire industry as a whole rather than just their own company.

To continue with this line of thought, when considering this 'free advertising' place yourself not as the reader but as an ally to these media in serving their readers and listeners, not forgetting technically, journalistically and morally, that advertisers are not entitled to preferential treatment. What interests the media? Ask yourself what interests you as a reader, read very carefully your local papers, listen intently to the radio and watch and listen to the local TV. How can you adapt your news items into their language? Are they interested in awards being won, human interest, record productivity or sales, business expansion, charitable contributions? My own company had several hundred dollars worth of flower seeds (no, not for growing my own plant) which we decided to offer to any charitable organisation for fund raising. A brief 40 word report was sent to six local newspapers, all of whom printed it mentioning our name in every case, the cost to us was \$2 for the stamps. The seeds would have been scrapped or given away in any case. That \$2 bought us some goodwill and exposed our name to many thousands of readers.

Percentage of Income

This is a popular method of establishing a budget and is usually based on industry averages or what the hire man and woman has spent in the past for advertising. It is based on the premise that advertising results from and is paid for by hire, while actually hire income results from advertising. The method is simple to use and many use it through sheer force of habit. One main question is whether or not to base the percentage on the previous year's figures or the pro-

jected income. Between 1% and 4% appears to be the norm on this basis.

Units of Hire

Specify an amount 'per box of apples', 'per car' or 'per hire contract' to be spent on advertising. If you write 5000 contracts and elect a figure of 50¢ per contract your budget would be \$2500.

What Can I Afford?

Look at your financial statement and relate advertising expenditure either to profits or assets. Being too conservative however may not yield enough money to accomplish the task and will leave the budget to chance.

Task Method

Define the task you want your money to perform. Determine the type and quantity of advertising and then estimate cost. In this way you build up your budget rather than setting a figure and then breaking it down. Other methods include copying your competitors if you can find out details; or the arbitrary (seat of pants) method where you say 'we will spend \$X000'; and finally, the '... or bust' method where every dollar you can get your hands on goes for advertising in probably a final bid to bring in the customers.

Future Methods

Maybe with the current onslaught of computers we shall see a new method of budgeting advertising expenditure evolving. Possibly your present information records are sufficient to show up weak areas which need beefing up and it may be possible therefore to be more selective and allocate part of your budget to this area and cut back on the more successful areas.

Which is best? Everyone has different ways to accomplish the same task and it is best to use the method which is most comfortable for you.


One final point - shouldn't those foolish enough to be offering discounts include this in their advertising budget? After all it is being used to promote extra customers and get them to come to you rather than your competitors!

Advertising alone will not cure any hire ills you may have, but it is as important as vitamins are to human growth. Are you suffering from malnutrition?

CYCLONE SCAFFOLDING WINS STAMP DUTY DECISION

Cyclone Scaffolding Pty. Ltd., whose business is the hiring of scaffolding, is not liable for Queensland stamp duty on amounts charged ADDITIONAL to the actual hiring fee. Charges referred to as additional, were delivery, labour, cleaning and repair of the scaffolding, insurance and stamp duty.

In a majority decision, the Queensland Supreme Court held that the additional charges were not received by the company "for or in relation to the use of goods" from its rental business, within the meaning of section 35B of the Queensland Stamp Act.

It held that scaffolding, when being transported, erected, cleaned, repaired, or insured was not being "used" and the additional charges were not received in relation to its use.

Following the decision stamp duty does not have to be paid by Cyclone Scaffolding Pty. Ltd. on any of the additional charges.

SALES TAX REFUNDS NOW AVAILABLE ON RETREAD TYRES PURCHASED SINCE JUNE 1983

The Tax Office has lost a long legal battle over sales tax on retread tyres. The legal fight, taken up by the AACC on behalf of retread-tyre manufacturers and dealers, centred on the definition of what constituted a manufactured product – the criteria for application of sales tax.

The Full Federal Court determined that the Tax Commissioner's Interpretation of the Sales Tax Act was invalid, and it has defined what constitutes a manufactured product. This decision has prevented the spread of sales tax to other items such as re-conditioned car engines, which are repaired in some way but are not manufactured items. As a result of this decision, "On customer instruction, any retread wholesaler could apply for refund of tax paid since June 1983" a Federal Government spokesman has stated.






