

PRESIDENT'S REPORT FEW HAVE NOT HAD A BUSY, PROFITABLE 1988

This has been an exciting term of office during our bi-centenial year together with World Expo and our 88 Convention being held in Queensland. There would be few in our industry who have not had a busy and profitable year.

The number of take-overs and establishment of new hire divisions by some large corporations indicates the attractiveness of our industry to those who see our potential.

What other service industry, by its own statements based on expensive surveys conducted at its own expense, enjoys only 7 per cent of its potential market? No wonder we are under the spotlight for investment.

What other service industry in this country is charging rates at around 50% less than its counterparts in other countries in the developed world? Many of these countries enjoy lower equipment and labour cost advantages to boot.

Convention of a Lifetime

I would be remiss not to mention a few facts and figures with regard to our "Convention of a Lifetime" held on the Gold Coast last August.

The best supported convention in our industry's history! Total delegate tally 339 and 88 separate exhibitors who occupied more than 120 display areas. Estimated sales made at the equipment exhibition were around \$17 million. Not only was it the largest held in our history, it was the biggest held at the Conrad International, up to that time.

We know the climate and the venue almost assures the success of conventions held in Queensland but the hardworking volunteer committee, coordinators and our Secretary Cathy Staines are to be congratulated and thanked for their efforts and dedication.

The smooth running of the programme (apart from the Oriana dinner cruise), the way the on-rush of non pre-registerd delegates and the last minute exhibitor registrations was handled, was a credit to their planning and performance of their several tasks.

Thanks to Sponsors

A word of thanks to our sponsors who contributed to the overall success of the convention by subsidising the cost of an expensive venue.

While on the subject of conventions it has been muted both at Queensland Region and National meetings that the National Committee consider the appointment of a National Convention Co-ordinator.

It is my belief that we are now financial enough


for this move and we should look at some of the past conventions our National Secretary has organised for other industry groups with which he has been associated.



The programme is designed for anyone who supervises or manages the work of others BUT who has NOT been to a previous Hire Association Supervisor's Training Programme.





WHAT PLANT EQUIPMENT VEHICLES SHOULD BE REGISTERED?





M any plant operators, hirers of equipment and other business people ask this question continually only to find that the local government authorities will give an opinion or interpretation of the relevant act in their State.

However, they will not commit themselves to writing and often you are left to decide yourself what should be registered, says Mr. T. P. Lane.

Director of Hire and Rental Insurance Brokerage Ltd., Mr. Lane said in an attempt to define more clearly the owner/operator's obligation in this area, HARIB had researched this topic and advise:

- *any vehicle/unit that is self-propelled must be registered whilst travelling on any public road in any State;
- *standard public liability policies normally exclude compensation for vehicles causing bodily injury if insurance is required by virtue of any legislation relating to motor vehicles;
- *permits are available in some States for use of unregistered vehicles. These are normally issued by an appointed authority - the issue of a trade plate is another method of protecting yourself against liability if a unit owned by you is used on a public road.
- *it is strongly recommended that you arrange third party insurance for all vehicles not registered, even if use is restricted to private property. This is a legal requirement in some States such as N.S.W. and Tasmania where even a trail bike must be insured.

Mr Lane said if you are unsure as to whether or not you should register a particular unit, obtain legal advice from your solicitor. The wording of the various State Acts is similar, he said. In most cases the Act defines:

Highway as any street, road, lane, bridge, thoroughfare or place open to or used by the public for passage with vehicles.

A Motor Vehicle is any selfpropelled vehicle used or intended for use on any highway and includes articulated vehicles, motor cycles, tractors and trailers.



HIRING FOR KEEPS

- IT'S A STEAL!

H iring for business is good business because it's quick, simple, cost and tax effective. But the owner should beware the "client" he does not know or cannot readily identify.

If it's too easy to hire expensive equipment the hirer may respond to temptation and, "At that price I'll take two; it's a steal".

Unknown "clients" are increasingly sophisticated about disguising who they actually are.

Theft by hirer affected 10% of all Hire and Rental Insurance Brokerage Ltd (HARIB) clients in the last six months of 1988 and unrecovered losses exceed \$90,000.

So what, you may say, that's what my insurance is about! So is the price of your insurance renewal and the cost of improving security procedures.

It may just be quicker, simpler, more cost and tax effective, in a word "cheaper", to know your hirer's background better. You'll never stop the professional burglar, pre-disposed to mount a major raid on your locked, secure yard, or the determined thief equipped with a false identity, false licence and false number plates on a stolen car!

But you can reduce the casual "tea leaf" level of theft and help the police and insurance companies to recover the stolen property if you:

*ask your client's address, before completing the official hire documents;

- *cross check the client's stated domicile with a driver's licence, note the driver's licence number and query any variance;
- *note hirer's vehicle registration number and vehicle description and;
- *take a polaroid photograph of the hirer.

It's probable the only folks you'll offend are those who wouldn't be coming back anyway, says HARIB.



WRECKAIR WINS \$1.5M HIRE AND MANAGEMENT CONTRACT

Wreckair Hire, has won a contract of more than \$1.5m to provide and manage a fleet of 26 forklift trucks at the Fibremakers Australia plant at Bayswater in suburban Melbourne.

The contract involved Wreckair buying the Fibremakers' fleet, replacing 13 vehicles in the first year and accepting full fleet management responsibilities for five years.

Leading hirer of plant and equipment, Wreckair Hire has established a repair and servicing facility at the Fibremakers plant to minimise downtime caused by routine maintenance or breakdowns. Wreckair Hire's John Pudney, who negotiated the contract with Fibremakers, estimates that about 25% of Australia's major forklift fleet owners are currently evaluating the economics of handing their fleets over to specialist hiring and operating companies.

"The costs of owning and managing a fleet are escalating continually", Mr Pudney said.

"The purchase price of a forklift has increased about 35% in the last two years or so, and the cost of maintaining specialist staff and workshops to look after the vehicles is quite high", he said. By selling their existing fleets to a

specialist company, many forklift owners are getting large injections of cash while being able to wash their hands of the day-to-day problems of capital purchase, maintenance and breakdowns", he said.

CONTAINERS FOR THE FUTURE.

Since the late 1970's, all international trade has been containerised. It's simply faster and cheaper to move goods in a few big boxes than to load individual items on and off trucks, trains, aircraft and ships.

Wreckair Container Services realised the savings its customers could achieve if load sizes, volumes and weights could be maximised. However, achieving that maximisation was sometimes difficult because Australia's 46-inch pallets cannot lie side-by-side in a standard international steel container. Wreckair Container Services, Melbourne solved the problem by manufacturing 500 containers (6mlong), wide enough to handle 10 pallets stacked on the floor. Within six months, these "jumbo" containers had all been hired and the industry was asking for more.

That was 18 months ago. Now, the company has plans to commission additional jumbo containers (12m-long) which will carry 20 standard pallets on the floor.

The search for more cost efficient containers is moving into other areas of the freight forwarding industry as well.

WRECKAIR AND RAIL

Wreckair is developing ties to the rail industry by supplying containers to rail-orientated interstate freight forwarders.

This "inter-modal" system saves time and money and means that cargo does not have to be handled each time it is moved by truck or train.

The container usually crosses Australia by rail before being delivered by truck to its final destination for unloading. Because the container is sealed and the contents are only handled twice, there is less chance of theft or damage.

Over the past two and a half years, Wreckair has responded to customer requests for containers with side load capability and even combinationfeatures, to solve particular loading problems.

The containers are imported from Europe, Japan, India and Korea, brought

up to international safety standards and put into service carrying dry, bulk or cold freight.

The network of Wreckair containers for hire spans 80 depots around Australia with major container parks in Melbourne and Sydney.

SEVEN MORE HIRER DEPOTS. Wreckair Hire has opened seven new depots and satellite depots, bringing its number of hire outlets across Australia to 81.

The new premises are at Kwinana and Bunbury in Western Australia; Gosford and Wetherill Park in New South Wales, and at Royal Pines and Twin Waters on Queensland's Gold and Sunshine Coasts.

Managing Director Ray Kelsey said that the company would open no fewer than 12 new and permanent premises this year as part of its continuing expansion.

WRECKAIR ROLE IN \$8M ALTONA SHUTDOWN

Wreckair Hire supplied 45 portable buildings and chemical toilets to support February's \$8 million maintenance shutdown at one of Australia's leading petrochemical companies.

Altona Petrochemical Company in Victoria believes the shutdown may set an Australian industrial record for the largest number of hours worked in the shortest time.

A crew of up to 500 company personnel and subcontractors were scheduled to take just 18 days to complete a staggering 120,000 hours of maintenance work at Altona between February 18 and March 12.

During the plant's mandatory fouryearly shutdown and inspection 1500 components were scrutinised and two SCAL-1 furnaces installed and linked to a new computerised control system.

SCAL-1 furnaces steam crack (break down) petrochemicals which are used to make raw materials for a multitude of consumer and industrial products. These range from plastic parts for cars to paint, packaging and kitchenware.

Wreckair Hire's 45 portable buildings and chemical toilets met the shutdown crew's ablution, dining and equipment storage needs.

The delivery of these units by road, was one of the largest movements of such buildings to be undertaken in Victoria this year.

The shutdown was co-ordinated by Melbourne-based World Services and Construction, a leading construction and engineering company which has more than 30 years' experience in the industry.

GKN SELLS INDUSTRIAL DIVISION

GKN Kwikform sold its industrial services division in mid-February to Unistrut Australia Pty. Ltd., a member of the Kalamazoo group of companies.

Among the businesses sold were GKN's raised floor systems, struts and electro-mechanical support systems.

Managing Director, Mr Alan Rose, said the reason for the sale was the weak strategic position of GKN in the major markets serviced by the division and the unlikelikhood of gaining market leadership in the near future.

"For one historical reason or another we have held a weak strategic position against our competitors and for the overall growth and strength of the company, the decision was made to exit those businesses which did not have a dominant market share", said Mr. Rose.

Melbourne's Whelan Rentals has had a major role in one of the world's largest "hold-ups" ever!

They helped to "frame" the 60-yearold T&G - an appropriate choice because it was on the same T&G site that the now "infamous" Whelan the Wrecker conducted his first rental raid in the 1930s!

Grocon of the Grollo Group "masterminded" the gigantic "hold-up" currently underway in the heart of Melbourne's central business district.

And Whelan Rentals collaborated with one of the largest "booms" in the game!

Grocon has the difficult task of retaining the massive facade of the T&G building which is included in the Historic Buildings Register of the National Trust.

Because it has been necessary to occupy a substantial portion of Russell Street, Grocon has had to overcome vehicle and pedestrian traffic problems on a scale never before seen in such a busy thoroughfare.

To retain the facade in place while the interior of the building is demolished a huge steel space frame consisting of 1000 tonnes of steel and looking like Darth Vader's meccano set was put together by Transfield.

Transfield project manager, Mr Glen Munro, said as far as he knew the job was the biggest of its type in the world.

He said the steel frame was needed to prevent the 40 metre high wall, which stretches 100 metres along Russell Street and about 50 metres along both Flinders Lane and Collins Street from crumbling due to wind or excessive vibration during demolition.

Mr Munro said one of the most challenging aspects of the job was to support an existing tower which is part of the old building.

Another of the challenges — apart from the sheer size of the project was that Transfield had to work within an extremely small space.

"We only really had one and a half lanes of Russell Street to work in to put the frame together", he said.

Whelan Rental's JLG Lift Model 80 HX (Pictured) one of the largest hydraulic booms in Melbourne, was used as a platform for employees welding beams and trusses as well as impacting nuts and bolts.

"Reach for it!"

The boom with its eight storey reach is proving popular at building sites around Melbourne.


Membership provides the hirer with contact to keep up to date on technology and other developments in the profession through trade evenings and Association publications, convention and general meetings.

LOBBYING A BIG TASK FOR HIRE ASSOCIATION

1988 has been, I'm certain, another successful year for the Hire Industry in general and as such has created many situations which have required continued representation on the Member's behalf regarding matters which could have damaging and financial effects on our business.

The major lobbying by the Association during the year was in relation to the "Electrical Guidlines for Construction Sites" and after many meetings with the DIRE we believe we had considerable success in having them accept our proposals for the testing of electrical equipment.

One of the major factors in our success was the excellent safety record which exists in our industry and we therefore must continue to maintain this very high standard in safety.

Although it is still not enough we also were successful in obtaining a personal commitment from Bruce Baird, the Minister for Transport, that Departments under his control (DMR and SRA) should and will accept liability for negligence in relation to damaged and stolen equipment.

The Association successfully brought to the attention of the Dept. of Motor Transport the anomalies existing in the law about log books being required for 2 tonne vehicles although a class one driver could legally drive a vehicle up to 4.5 G.V.M. There were many other subjects addressed by the Association during the year with operators for mini excavators, votergrams and occupational superannuation being just a few.

One area which is always being discussed and has now taken a positive step, due to the work from the Queensland Association, is the setting up of a standard acceptable training scheme for the Industry working closely with TAFE Colleges. We are following the progress of this and will be pursuing it further with education institutions in NSW.

Unfortunately in September we had to accept the resignation of our President John Metcalf who decided to have a rest from the industry and we must thank John sincerely for his dedication and efforts during his term in office.

The National Hire Convention in 1988 was held at Jupiters Casino on the Gold Coast and was well attended by members throughout Australia and I'm sure everyone there had a terrific time.

This years convention is in Melbourne (September 5th - 7th) and, although maybe not as glamorous a location, I'm sure the Victorians will have a great event organised.







President Trevor Tuffnell recently attended the American Rental Association Annual Convention in Orlando and upon his return wrote the following "light hearted" report on his trip.

"Having received a very kind invitation through A. R. A. President Richard Frechette to attend their Annual Convention and equally important a leave pass from Ann, I accepted with an almost indecent amount of enthusiasm. I travelled to Orlando in the company of another Kiwi delegate and had a somewhat uneventful series of flights apart from after a late take off from Houston at 11.00 pm when the pilot said he had a spot of bother and sent the flight engineer down the aircraft with a torch to inspect the wing. I sort of felt there was a degree of optimism that he could see much in the middle of a rainstorm, however we were subsequently told all was well and that after that the Chivas Regal was 'on the house'.

Arrived in Orlando in the middle of winter, immediately discarded my jacket and only wore it once during the week. The Exhibition was held in the Orange Country Convention Hall and the Seminars were held in the Peabody Hotel which was directly opposite. The Opening was held at the Orlando Sea World and this took the form of some very patriotic singing and music provided by an American Naval Band followed by the Introduction of the elected Officers of the A. R. A., and the presentation of President Richard's annual report and welcome. The following day it was straight into business with a wide topic range of seminars being available during the morning and the equipment exhibition was open. The format remained the same each day with the Exhibition open all day and seminars during the morning

The Exhibition was very large by any standard with approximately 600 Exhibitors taking part and was run on a very professional basis. Naturally the product range was very wide and there were a considerable number of products that are not seen in our country. This was particularly noticeable in the Party Hire, the variety of champagne fountains was truly incredible. I suppose the real problem with a lot of what one saw would be the price of the product after it has landed back in New Zealand and by the time duty (which is still quite high in some product lines), freight, insurance and the like are added, not to forget the exchange rate, what at first seems like a real bargain tends to lose its appeal.

The organisation of the Convention would be very hard to fault. The shuttle bus system, registered desk efficiency and Equipment Exhibition layout all showed a high degree of professionalism. No doubt the sheer size generates considerable income and having the funds must reduce one's problems. A very pleasant International Guests night was held in the Peabody Hotel when it was indeed a pleasure to renew the acquaintence of Richard and Elaine Frechette and James and Bobby-Jo Irish. Transport was available every half hour to take delegates to the Epcot Centre and to Disneyworld but because of time constraints I was unable to see these places totally. Maybe next time. I did manage, however, to spend a day at the Kennedy Space Centre. This is certainly a must stop if you are in the Orlando area. The presentation is well done, the size of the whole centre, roading systems, vehicle assembly building etc. is hard to comprehend.

All in all a great trip which I will not forget for some time. I still believe that our draught beer takes a lot of beating." The 1989 New Zealand Convention programme is largely complete. The Convention will commence on Wednesday 20th September with a choice of a Yard Tour or a Party Hire Seminar and will be followed that evening by the Welcoming Cocktail Party and Dinner. 



TAKEUCHI PLEASED ON AUST, NZ VISIT

T he designer and builder of Takeuchi mini-excavators, Mr Akio Takeuchi visited Australia and New Zealand in March in the course of a Pacific tour to familiarise himself with the southernmost parts of his world market.

Mr. Takeuchi, who was accompanied by the General Manager of Takeuchi Manufacturing Company Limited, Mr Masayuki Dokoshi, was on a visit to the New Zealand agent, Compacting Equipment Limited of Petone.

CPL's wholly owned subsidiary -Takeuchi Australia Pty. Limited markets the units throughout Australia.

In a week's tour of New Zealand, starting in Dunedin and ending in Auckland, the visitors met customers and saw Takeuchi's range of models in operation. It was the first visit to New Zealand for the Takeuchi designer and he said he was impressed with the growth of the New Zealand operation since Compacting Equipment Limited secured the agency in 1983 and then launched Takeuchi Australia Pty Limited in 1987.

Mr. Takeuchi is president and sole owner of the company that bears his name and built the first mini excavator in 1971 in their plant at Nagano, Japan.

Mr. Takeuchi is emphatic his company is the current leader in mini excavator sales in western Europe and that his market will continue to grow world-wide.

In the last three years total units produced for Japan alone has increased 100%, from 15,000 to 30,000. A further 10,000 machines were produced for export.

The small size of the units enables them to penetrate work areas not normally accessible to larger machines.

Owen reports that a customer who hired an airless spray unit from them, put his finger over the spray nozzle while the unit was running in an attempt to clear paint build up from the tip.




The paint was immediately injected into the mans finger and he was taken to hospital where the finger was amputated.



n exciting first in Australia is the release of a range of generating sets which incorporate a hand-held radio-remote-control start/stop system by Advanced **Power Products.**

The development (patent pending) comes close on the heels of an Australian Design Award won by them for development of their "Intelligen", a high-tech microcomputer monitoring control protection system for and generator installations.

The Radio-Remote system consists of a small, lightweight electronic control module with in-built radio receiver and aerial, mounted on or near the generating set. A tiny hand held pushbutton transmitter containing an integrated miniature battery supply activates the generator (pictured).

This system is sure to revolutionise generator operation as it could not be simpler to use. A single press of the button on the hand held transmitter will start the generator - another press will stop it.

For cold starting, the operator can hold the button down for about 3 seconds which will activate the choke control or alternatively an inbuilt logic circuit will detect the need for the choke and automatically operate the choke solenoid.

In the case of a diesel generator the fuel shut off valve is automatically operated on receipt of a start or stop signal.

Because the operator has complete freedom to start and stop the generator from up to 100 metres away as standard, or from a greater distance with optional equipment, it is sure to prove popular with builders, tradesmen and farmers. An override switch is also fitted on

In rural homes the generator can now be shut down after the household is bedded down, in emergency power situations it could be operated from wherever you are at the time and builders will particularly appreciate being able to start and stop their generator from virtually anywhere on the building site.

Advanced Power also has a system called Rev-a-Matic and it's a small and reliable electronic module which senses when electric power is required.

The module then automatically operates the throttle and speeds up the engine to its correct running speed. When no electric power is required, Rev-a-Matic reduces the engine speed to an idle again.

Powermate 500, a compact portable generator is a third in the company's range.

Lincoln's MIG welder "GOES to its work!"

Engineers, builders, farmers and trades people on the move will find many uses for the compact new Australian-made MIG welder just released by The Lincoln Electric Company (Aust) Pty Ltd, of Padstow, NSW.

The Lincoln Jetmig 195, using continuous wire electrode and operated from a three-pin 240V plug, can be moved around the workshop or factory on its wheels and is easily carried in a ute to outside jobs.

The welder is particularly suited for light industrial sheet metal work, such as in panel shops, and for rural welding on single phase power. It handles both aluminium and

It handles both aluminium and stainless steel welding, and can also be used with flux cored 0.9mm NR211MP mild steel electrode to avoid the inconvenience of gas bottles. It is supplied with a lightweight MIG gun with a rotating gooseneck, so that it can be swung around, on three metres of cable. A quick release "Euro" type bayonet fitting on the gun cable makes electrode changeover and liner replacement simple.

The four-wheel trolley is fitted with an integral bottle rack and chain. A regulator flow meter and gas inlet hose are supplied.

The drive reel to feed out electrode has two grooves - one to accept 0.6mm solid wire and the other for 0.8/0.9mm — is reversible for quick release.

The primary cable from the power point is 5 metres long, and there is also a 5m heavy duty ground cable and clamp.
