



Two months ago I visited over 40 different Hire Companies over 3 States. The very clear message was certainly of tighter trading conditions and a wait and see type attitude, as many companies were at a loss to explain why the trading environment was so patchy.

Almost everybody believed that the change in Government could only be positive for the economy, but to date there has been no evidence of this being the case.

I am sure that all of you understand that essentially everybody is in the same situation. Attendance at Association gatherings, in general, would show that companies from all different market types, and suppliers of varied ranges of equipment are all being affected.

One thing that all of us that have been in the industry for a long time know, is that the current situation has been before and will no doubt come again

Times like these demand trained staff, excellent customer relations, reliable and well presented equipment and a positive attitude.

You can do a lot to improve your business in many different ways, even a coat of paint to your premises sends a positive message to your customers. What about uniforms for your staff if you don't have them, or a change if you do?

The new budget, the just announced reduction in interest rates, will all have a positive affect. Be ready!

During my visit to many Hire Companies it was also clear of a disturbing lack of awareness of the obligation to Occupational Health and Safety. This legislation and it's obligations are far reaching, and for this reason our magazine is starting a series of articles to bring some light on what you need to do to make sure your business is protected.

It is also my belief that our environmental responsibilities will become more prominent in the future and this is something that a lot of our industry is still not prepared for. Are you washing equipment down and letting the run off go into the drains? How are you disposing of or storing hazardous substances?

The Association has prepared an environmental supplement to our Safety Manual which covers all of these issues. If you haven't already got a copy I suggest that it may be a very worthwhile investment.

The National Plant Standards are now also gaining momentum. Whilst they have only been introduced in Victoria at this stage, the legislation will definitely be going Australia wide. Your State Association can keep you in touch with what is happening. Make sure you find out as it will affect you.

Lastly, a reminder on our National Hire Convention, 22nd - 26th September 1996 in Sydney. The New South Wales Committee has worked extremely hard to bring you a professional balanced program. All they need is you. Regards,

From the Editor

Government and private enterprise the debate continues

Government involvement with private enterprise has long been a contentious issue. There are times when it is seen as a more viable proposition for the Government to outsource its public works. This appears to be becoming a modern day trend. The VicRoads sale of its plant and putting the road maintenance out to tender, is one modern day example. While South Australian Roads are also going down this path, with the calling for tenders to maintain their roadwork in that state. Obviously having done its homework on the VicRoads operation.

In this era of accountability Government is constantly under pressure to perform, the question of whether private enterprise could do better is never far from the surface. Unfortunately the opportunity to make comparison is limited. The Government has the sole right to govern. But Government, be it Federal, State, or Local on occasions sets up a Government Trading Enterprises, GTE, in order to compete in the private enterprise arena.

The question of whether Government should be involved in private enterprise in competition with private enterprise is one that has supporters for both sides.

One line of thought is that the Government was elected to govern, and should confine itself to just that. Voicing the opinion that if Government wishes to be involved in business, then it should look to the business of providing a profitable public transport system, more hospitals or better roads.

While supporters of their involvement, maintain that if private enterprise was doing their job there would be no room for Government

This action invariably prompts a great deal of debate, as to the credentials of GTE'S to compete in this area, as very few could boast a good " track record' in their public service careers. But some of the more compelling questions which this action raises are; * Should Taxpayers money be used to fund such operations?

* Is the GTE'S participation depriving private companies of business?

* Can GTE'S operate more economically than private enterprise companies?

* Does the public benefit from the GTE'S involvement?

* Do GTE'S gain any advantage because of their status?

The Governments policy on GTE'S competing with private enterprise clearly states that GTE,S' should not enjoy any competitive advantage as a result of their public sector ownership".

Over the years some private enterprise companies, competing with GTE'S, have at times, stressed their concern as to there being a level playing field for those involved.

The Department of Corrective Services producing textiles in opposition to textile manufacturers is a modern day example.

The savings in production costs by the use of prison labour in comparison to the textile manufacturers appears obvious.

Should Taxpayers money be used to fund such operations is one question which springs immediately to mind. While it could be argued that such operations may provide inmates with the opportunity to pay their way during their incarceration.

Undoubtably different circumstances prevail with different industries.

Therefore, a NSW State GTE'S entry into the hire and rental industry is an interesting exercise, that will be viewed with a great deal of interest by those involved in the industry, in the upcoming future.

AH PLANT EXPANDS INTO NEW SOUTH WALES

One of Sydney's largest hirers of excavation equipment, Reid's Excavations, has recently joined forces with Australia's giant in the road plant hire business, AH Plant.

The arrangement took effect from the first of June 1996.

Explaining the joining together of the two companies one of the owners of Reid's Mr. Alan Bird, who is continuing as manager said it was a matter of achieving the benefits of economies of scale and it also enables us to give a rapid response to the range of infrastructure and other projects planned for Sydney over the next four years.

Reid's primary activity has been the hiring of excavation equipment and dump trucks associated with roads, railway lines and construction sites. The company's fleet of equipment is largely based on excavators (4-45 tonne), dump trucks (2-35 tonne), loader backhoes and skid steer loaders.

Following on from the joining with AH Plant the Reid's business will now have access to a far broader range of equipment particularly specialized road plant which includes dozers, graders and compaction equipment.

The former owners of Reid's, the Bird and Corbett families purchased the company in 1989 and have steadily developed and expanded the company over the last seven years.

"Employees and permanent sub contractors number over 60 and with the huge back up of equipment through AH Plant we plan to add to our employee numbers," said Alan. AH Plant's fleet exceeds 2,000 items. In 1994 it acquired the entire VicRoads fleet when the Victorian Government decided to scale down it's own activity in road building and road maintenance and, instead, turn to contractors, selling off VicRoads huge fleet of road building plant and road maintainence plant.

AH Plant purchased the fleet at a cost of \$ 42 million and the engaging of 121 of the VicRoads staff employed in the plant section. Also included in the deal was a hire - back of certain specified equipment and a limited number of motor vehicles over a five year period for an annual fee of \$ 13.5 million (net present value of \$50 million over the five year period).

AH Plant Executive Chairman Mr. Ray Kelsey believes the joining with Reid's is a vital and strategic move for his company.

"We have been planning our expansion in NSW for sometime he said but it has been a matter of waiting to find the right organizations," he said.

"Initially, we acquired Border Action Hire in Albury followed by the setting up of a branch in Wagga Wagga. But, it is the joining up with Reid's Excavations that is the key move for us in NSW," he added.

Both Government and contractors operating in the greater Sydney area now have the capacity of Reid's equipment which is hired with operators and now the resources of AH Plant's fleet, much of which is available on a wet or dry hire basis.

"our equipment includes dozers, one of Australia's largest fleets of graders and compaction equipment, specialised bituminous road surfacing equipment Flocon trucks and other road plant.

"And, we back that fleet with a wide array of traffic management equipment," said Mr. John Stewart, AH Plant's marketing manager.

"With the increasing demands placed on contractors these days to get through the work and with tight deadlines they need more and more resources behind them. And, ideally, they need that extra capability without the financial demands of ownership or fixed term leasing.

"The specialist hire companies that can operate with huge fleets represent an extremely viable solution for more and more contractors, both big and small," said Mr. Stewart,

GO HIRE - A FAMILY BUSINESS

ike us all Peter Hinde has plenty to thank his parents for. It was Peter's parents John and Daphne who started the hire business now known as Go Hire, that Peter operates in Dapto, on the south coast of New South Wales.

John and Daphne Hinde arrived in Australia with their son Peter and his two brothers, David and Martyn in 1966 and spent the first six months in the Berkeley hostel. They then purchased a small property at West Dapto.

John's early working career was varied, spending the first six months at BHP as a tally clerk, he then worked as a warder at Long Bay for a while before returning to Dapto where he operated a bread run.

John and Daphne then moved on to a fruit juice run, which they built up and sold at a profit. Always looking for something to improve themselves they then became involved in running swimming pool kiosk's. But it was during the period when John operated a Pet Shop that he started to supplement his income by supplying party hire equipment.

Starting with a meagre amount of stock, they began to make small inroads into Party Hire in the area.

Shortly afterwards L & L Hirings Pty. Ltd., the only Party Hire business in Wollongong at the time, was up for sale. John and Daphne decided to concentrate on Hire business, sold the pet shop and purchased the business.

L & L Hirings supplied Marquees, Stages, Tables and Chairs and operated out of rented premises in 120

Auburn Street. Wollongong. But after three months John and Daphne decided to shift the business to their West Dapto premises to save paying rent.

The purchase of the business gave the young restless Peter, then in year 11 in High School, the opportunity to join the workforce. Going straight to work for his parents, alongside their only other employee. Peter started offsider for deliveries until acquiring his license.

The business progressed despite customers experiencing very bad access problems, with all members of the family " pitching in" to lend a hand. Even Peter's girlfriend, Lynne being coerced into helping out on special occasions. Obviously the job agreed with Lynne, as she and Peter eventually were married and Lynne is the Office Administrator today.

In 1977 the Hinde family decided to bite the bullet and purchased premises in Hamilton Street, Dapto, and built a 35' X 105' storage and service area for the Party Hire Equipment.

Two years on, the owner of Dapto Hire, (a small handyman equipment business) which was situated only a few doors away in Hamilton street, decided to retire and offered the business to the Hinde family, so they added a general hire to their range. Although the cost to update the rundown stock put a strain on the families resources, they managed to keep their head above water .

Peter's younger brother Martyn then joined the

family business. Shortly after Wollongong Shed Hire and RAE Hire were acquired.

With so many names of their acquisitions it was decided to change the name of the business to Go Hire. Something short and sweet.

The business progressed and Peter grew up with it, learning the rudiments of the hire industry from his parents, gradually assuming more responsibility as he got older. Peter said he knew when he had " arrived" in the hire business, when his parents began to take longer annual holidays. He took over the running of the business in 1986. But John and Daphne continued their involvement, in fact are only' planning their retirement this year.

In 1984 a General and Party Hire branch was opened in Corrimal. This was followed by the purchase of the property at Prince Edward Drive, Dapto, which now serves as head office


While Go Hire had started out as a Party Hire suplier, and is still the market leader in the area, it gradually diversified and now services Local and State Governments, local building companies and contractors and handymen as well as party and event rentals

With a permanent staff of 20 plus casuals, Go Hire is continually updating and looking at market trends. In 1995 a new General Equipment and Party Hire store in Shellharbour was opened at Oak Flats, which continues to grow with the area.

The same year Go Hire received recognition in the Illawarra district when it was awarded the Service to the Industry award for 1994 presented by the Wollongong Chamber of Commerce and the Chamber of Manufactures (now Australian Business Ltd). This award followed on from Peter being nominated as one of the finalist in the Illawarra 1992 Business Person of the Year award.

Peter nominates one of the reason for the success of the business in the last few years has been the excellent staff, who all have a very positive attitude towards their work.

Go Hire intends to continue to grow and to search for opportunities in all facets of hire. Plans have been approved for extensions to the property at Prince Edward street and these extensions include a two story storage building to be erected to house the party hire equipment. These extensions are part of the expansion of Go Hire as Peter and his staff carry on and build on the foundations of this family business which Peter's parents, John and Daphne started and has been servicing the Illawarra district for 23 years.



Coates Hire Float closes early

The \$170m public float of Coates Hire, Australia's largest hire company, closed two weeks early after strong demand from institutional and retail investors.

The float came after parent company ANI placed Coates on the market at a price of \$ 200 m in February. But after fielding inquiries from interested parties, Western Australian hire company Cockburn, Brambles and Wreckair, which failed to reach this figure, the company was floated on July 8th.

The float, which was fully underwritten by Ord Minnett, comprising of 68 million shares at \$2 per share was closed due to being oversubscribed within two weeks. This figure combined with the nett debt of the company of \$34m, made up the sale price of \$170m.

Coates is Australia's largest general equipment hire company, with 75 branches throughout Australia, an estimated 20% of the hire market.

They also have developing interest in Indonesia,

where it first entered the market in 1993 and remains the only substantial general equipment hire company in that country.

With an estimated total revenue for 1996 of \$115.9m and a nett profit after tax of \$10.4m, Coates is expected to continue to pursue areas of established growth, while still searching for new areas of involvement.

A look at the two sets of figures shown below show how Coates have diversified their interests from 1990-1996,by following the market trends, which have seen it become more involved in areas such as the acquisition of Prestige Poretables, plus a concentration on Access Equipment, which is seen as a future growth area because of its widening variety of useage, while reducing its exposure to the Australian construction industry.



JLG DOMINATES GROWTH OUTLOOK FOR ACCESS EQUIPMENT

Dave Black, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of JLG Industries Inc. recently visited JLG's Australian operations. He also hosted several functions and industry briefings attended by members of the Australian hire industry and access equipment users.

Dave Black said that JLG's corporate plan provided for the release of 21 new models of electric scissor lifts, boom lifts and personnel access equipment during 1996.

He commented that JLG has enjoyed over 40 percent annual compound sales growth since 1990 and some 70 percent of its total annual production of access equipment went into the fleets of hire companies around the world.

Reflecting the demand for access equipment from both general industry and the hire sector, JLG has recently purchased an additional manufacturing plant in the USA and is targeting a reduction in manufacturing throughput times from a current 26 days to 10 days per machine.

Dave Black forecast that the current world market for aerial work platforms and scissor lifts of 50,000 units annually, would double to 100,000 units annually by the end of the decade.

He attributed the access equipment industry's growth outlook to the increased standards of occupational health and safety in the workplace and the recognition by business that better and safer work practices delivered results in the form of faster project commissioning, increased productivity and workplace safety.

"In the USA we are finding that even the local electrician is now provided with his own scissor lift platform on a job. Access equipment is now considered a tool of the trade" Black added.







The High cost of Environmental damage

Recent court findings highlight the enormous community, government and media attention now given to environmental issues. 'Pollution', 'contamination' and 'green' are 'in' words for journalists, politicians and law-makers. The trend is for even more pressure world-wide, as we become aware of the potentially disastrous consequences of failing to care for our environment.

For the first time in Australia, (1995), a director has been jailed. For 12 weeks as a result of an environmental offence by his company which he knowingly allowed to happen. The offence was discharging toxic waste into a drain instead of having it removed by a licensed waste disposal contractor. The maximum penalty was \$10,000, or six months imprisonment, or both. Penalties can be up to \$1 million for a corporation and \$250,000 for persons for some environmental offences.

Two other examples, among many over recent years, involve directors being fined \$10,000 and \$15,000 and their companies, \$33,000 and \$75,000 respectively for allowing run-off water to pollute a stormwater drain and a nearby river. Penalties can apply even for accidental contamination as with spills, leakage, bund overflow or contamination from run-off carried by stormwater.

Equipment hire companies are specifically listed as 'Trade Waste Generators' in the NSW water authority guidelines for on-site treatment of trade waste. Run-off from un-roofed yards and fuel dispensing should have some pre-treatment before entering stormwater drainage systems in most states because it carries particles of dirt, rubber, paint, fuel, lubricants and other pasties' which could contaminate waters. This is expected to apply to all states eventually. You are not allowed to wash vehicles on the road or where the wash-water could run on to the road or into a drain. Regulations are getting much tougher at a fast rate, and management should be preparing for the future.

Cases of property acquisitions are reported, where the new owner has had to bear the cost (up to \$100,000), for remediation of long-term and previously undetected slow fuel leakage from several underground tanks. The subsequent costly court action to get the previous owner to compensate added to total costs for both the buyer and the seller.

These are just some of the things that show the special care needed by management of Hire and Rental companies. Wise managers and owners will start including environmental issues in their management planning and procedures. And we all know that an industry that does not care, is one that invokes even more government regulatory control

The Hire and Rental industry may not be expected to have any major pollution disasters associated with it. But there are many mid-ranking and minor offences that could occur, even with the best of intentions, in all categories, - air, water, noise and waste disposal. For example, most businesses will have fuel storage and dispensing, washing down of equipment with run-off, large un-roofed areas with stormwater run-off, noise associated with workshops, equipment testing and emitted by rented equipment. An audit and EMS will find and control the risks associated with these things.

Perhaps you feel that your business is too small to have environmental concerns. Then read on, - you might be surprised

Some Environmental Issues for Hire and Rental Businesses.

The casual observer may think that small Hire and Rental businesses need not have much concern for environmental matters. But a quick look at some potential offenses that could bring fines, some of which may be very heavy or involve the cost of remedial action and court costs, or losses on sale or acquisition, will surely change their minds. Some of the most likely incidents, but not all that could occur for rental operations of all sizes, are listed below:

Discharging wastes, - toxic, or environmentally hazardous. to stormwater or sewer

• Discharging fuel, (diesel or petrol), waste lubricating oil or oil sludge, paint, solvent, degreasing solutions, batteries, (which contain lead and acid), or any other environmentaly damaging substances, intentionally or accidentally, which could contaminate stormwater or sewage or natural waterway by seepage or by stormwater action. Discharges may be by way of spill or leaks, known or unknown to the company or person in charge. Applies especially to fuel dispensing and tank filling locations. It includes leaks from underground tanks or pipes and stormwater run-off from filling and dispensing.

• Failure to adequately bund toxic or environmentally hazardous liquids held in excess of minimum quantities, such as fuels, oils, solvents etc. (A bund is a dam for containing leaks or spills of liquids, usually at depots or storage points).

• Allowing washwater from the cleaning of vehicles, cement mixers, or equipment of any kind to discharge into catchment areas of stormwater drainage, (e.g., on roads), creeks, rivers, lakes, swamps or 'wetlands'. Applies to roofed or unroofed areas of a yard.

• Having a large un-roofed area or yard containing equipment, from which stormwater can discharge to council or water authority drains.

Note: This is a common problem in the industry.

Failure to maintain a septic tank as required by your local council, or install or use one without permit
Discharges to atmosphere, - ozone damaging,

hazardous or objectionable odour.

• Discharging visible smoke, (not water vapour), from a motor vehicle for more than 10 seconds.

• Removing or interfering with pollution control devices on a vehicle.

• Discharging refrigerant such as Freon (CFC) from air conditioners or refrigerators.

• Discharging BCF or Halon fire extinguishers, other than to extinguish a fire. (Use of such ozonedamaging extinguishing media is prohibited after 1st. January, 1996.) If due for service or test before that date, such as extinguishers are to be discarded.

• Open burning of any kind, such as tires, waste oil, packaging material, paint, plastic and general refuse. (Refer to local regulations, often controlled by local government councils or shires)



Mobile hydraulic plant alert

The purpose of this alert is to inform designers, manufacturers, suppliers, employers, and self-employed people of the dangers associated with operating and maintaining mobile hydraulic plant. This alert comes via the Health and Safety Organisation (Victoria).

Background

Recently a mechanic was fatally injured while repairing the hydraulic circuit which controlled the movement of the boom arms of a skid steer loader. The hydraulic circuit was accessible from the front of the machine by folding the operator's seat up and backwards.

It appears the mechanic had raised the boom arms in order to gain easy access to the circuit from the front of the machine. The mechanic cracked open the flare nut of one of the supply lines to the cylinders of the boom releasing the hydraulic pressure which allowed the boom and buckets to descend, crushing the worker.

The skid steer loader was provided with pins to support the boom in such circumstances, however, one of these pins had been cut off after being bent during operation. While the other pin had been tied back so that it could not operate.

There was also a potential for confusion in that the right hand pedal on the machine operates the left hand spool which in turn operates the bucket, while the left hand pedal operates the boom arms via the right hand spool. The deceased had not received training in the correct

work method, which was available on video from the supplier of the skid steer loader.

Preventative measures

In order to prevent a similar tragedy in the future:

• hydraulic circuitry should be designed and supported by clear maintenance information to avoid confusion to people who may work on it;

• safety devices (support pins in this case) provided by the manufacturer should be maintained in good working order and used (to support the raised boom arms); and,

• employers should ensure that employees receive training in the correct method of work and maintenance as provided by the manufacturer or, if this is not available, develop and document an appropriate work maintenance procedure.

Previous fatalities

Three skid steer loader operators were killed between April 1987 and July 1989. In each case the operator attempted to leave the operator's compartment with the bucket raised. In each case the operator inadvertently operated the foot control which allowed the bucket to lower, crushing the victim. In August 1988, while cleaning cement from a truck, a man was crushed between the topper tray and truck chassis, when he released a wire cable which resulted in the hydraulic ram lowering the topper tray.

In July 1990 a 28-year old man was crushed when he was leaning over the chassis of a top truck and the tray came down on him.

In July 1992 a 33-year old man was crushed by a tipper body that was being suspended from a mobile crane when the brake/hydraulics failed on the crane.

In September 1992 a 45-year old man was struck by a rapidly descending tipper tray after he disconnected the hydraulics hose from the hydraulic ram.

In May 1994 a 35-year old man was carrying out mechanical repairs to a motor when the hydraulic cylinder supporting the raised cabin of the truck failed allowing the cabin to drop, crushing him between the motor and cabin.

Each of these fatalities highlight the dangers associated with moving or working under loads suspended by mobile hydraulic plants.

Similar tragedies may be avoided if the following are undertaken:

• employers should ensure that the safe work and maintenance practices recommended by the manufacturer are followed or, if this is not available, develop and document an appropriate work and maintenance procedure;

• employers should ensure that all operating and maintenance staff are trained and understand the safe work procedures;

• safety devices are maintained in good working order and are not bypassed or modified; and,

• employees follow all work procedures provided by their employer and report any malfunctions of, or damage to, plant.

Statutory requirements

Sections 21, 22 and 24 of the Occupational Health and Safety Act 1985 set out the duties of employers, selfemployed people, designers, manufacturers and suppliers of plant respectively.

Adopting the preventative measures outlined in this alert will assist these people in meeting their obligations under the Occupational Health and Safety Act 1985.

The OHS (Plant) Regulations 1995 require employers to undertake hazard identification for all plant in the workplace as soon as possible.

Having performed this, a risk assessment must be undertaken and, finally, the risks must be controlled.

The Code of Practice for Plant provides guidance on this, and may be purchased from any Law Printer office.







HSO AND WORKCOVER JOIN FORCES

The Minister for Finance, Roger Hallam, and the Minister for Industry, Mark Birrell, announced recently that the Health and Safety Organisation and the Victorian WorkCover Authority are to be amalgamated, with the WorkCover Authority becoming responsible for workplace health and safety and workers' compensation.

Mr Hallam, who is also the Minister responsible for WorkCover, said the amalgamation would produce a more effective approach to workplace safety and wold be brought about through legislation introduced in this session of State Parliament.

"It is a commonsense move which amalgamates Victoria's two organisations which have responsibilities for workplace health and safety and perform complementary functions," he said.

"It will benefit employers who prefer to deal with one body in terms of workplace safety and compensation, and it will also benefit workers by ensuring that offering incentives for workplace safety and monitoring of employers' performance in this area are the province of the same organization.

"This gives real teeth to Victoria's approach to occupational health and safety.

"The new structure follows the path of other states which have similar integrated workplace safety and workplace compensation structures," Mr Hallam said.


Mr Hallam said Victoria was widely recognised both in Australia and overseas for its achievement in workers' compensation and promoting workplace health and safety. Under WorkCover, Victoria has turned around an increased return to work rates for injured workers.

The incentives in Victoria's experienced based premium system and our promotion of workplace health and safety are setting the standard in Australia," Mr Hallam said. General Manager of the former HSO, Ms Kaye Owen said "The HSO welcome the amalgamation to ensure a more integrated approach to administration of health and safety in Victoria. The combined organistion will give even more strength to the government's efforts to improve the health and safety performance in this state.

"We will continue to maintain high quality service, and as such customers of the former HSO are assured of our ongoing commitment to excellence in health and safety service provision," Ms Owen said.



Forklifts Reign Supreme

Since the world began man has always needed some form of materials handling. As the world has grown so has this need. Today the success of every process plant, manufacturing facility and warehouse depends to a large extent on the efficient handling, storage and transportation of materials. In many cases the cost of the handling and transporting material has a significant impact on the final cost of the product. While there have been many different forms of materials handling equipment developed, none can match the longevity of the Forklift Truck which has become a symbol of materials handling. Whereas advancing technology has replaced many other forms of materials handling, nothing has been found to replace the forklift.

Forklifts were in use as far back as 1920, but they come to prominence during World War 2 due to the lack of equipment and their versatility. Time has seen many improvements since the crude models of those days and the modern day models have two forms of power, the Internal Combustion (IC) engine which encompasses Petrol engines, Diesel and LPG and the Battery Electric models. The IC models are by far the most popular, their more powerful engines, ability to work over long periods, indoors and outdoors, and to operate on rough and uneven terrain gives them the advantage to the extent that 70 - 80% of models in use today are powered by IC engines. Technology is rapidly improving the battery electric models, but they are mainly coming into their own for indoor use especially where foodstuff is involved, because of the accent on health and safety. It is expected that the IC models will continue to be the more predominantly used models for some time to come. The range of Forklifts has grown with industry needs and now extends from the walk- behind models to the 40 ton models used to transport containers on the wharves, rail terminals and container parks.

But it is the ride - on 900 kg - 4500 kg which is the most commonly used. An examination of earlier models of these models shows that although continually producing many technology is performance enhancing improvements, such as more powerful motors, greater fuel consumption, driver comfort and safety, the shape and design has remained the same for several years. Materials Handling

The great majority of Forklifts in Australia are imported, with most of the worlds major manufacturers, such as, Nissan, Crown, Clarke, Linde, Hyster Toyota and Yale all having dealerships in Australia. These dealers act as suppliers to the industry, while also having their own hire division. This creates a situation where the suppliers are competing with their clients as well as independent importers in a very competitive hire market.

It is very difficult to estimate the size of the forklift hire market, as they service so many industries, in city as well as country areas. It ranges from Brambles, the largest Forklift hire company in Australia, with a fleet of 5,000 trucks nationally, which does not have a Forklift dealership, but purchases various brands of machines to make up their hire fleet, to the small operator with his handful of trucks. But of the 6000 Forklifts sold annually in Australia, it is estimated 2000 of these find their way into hire.

The Forklift hire industry is split into two divisions long term hire and short term hire. The long term hire side of the industry being by far the more competitive, has been experiencing continuous growth over the last few years. Many companies are finding that the package deals provided by the suppliers which include, no capital outlay, complete service, maintenance and parts replacement, while also allowing a company to budget for future forklift use for periods of sometimes 1 - 5 years ahead, make up a very appealing deal, compared to the capital outlay necessary to purchase and maintain a fleet of forklifts. The forklift companies in this case are in essence service providers. Taking over the complete service, maintenance and any parts replacements needed during the period of the hire, the cost of which is included in the original hire contract


The short time hire market is dependent on seasonal peaks, breakdown of a companies existing machines or, any other reason a business may need a forklift for a short time. Whatever the reason for the need, hiring saves the business the outlay of capital to purchase forklift equipment which may only be used occasionally.

The forklift industry could be seen as one which will almost assuredly continue to show growth. Forklifts have become so much a part of industry that as industry grows so will their use.

Computerising your Hire Business – III

Integrated systems — what they mean

In the first two articles in this series we have offered advice on how to go about finding the right computer system for your Hire business. We have discussed the hardware, what it all means and what you may require to run the software you select.

We have also detailed all the different modules that make up the ideal software system for a Hire business and some of the benefits you can expect to derive from selecting the "right" system.

One of the key words that keeps popping up when discussing business computer systems is that word "Integration". So just what does it mean when everybody tells you the software you choose must be "fully integrated"? In simple terms it means that the various modules making up your software package should be linked so that information only needs to be entered into the system where that information required. In this, our third article, we will look at what

> an integrated system means and explore some of the benefits.

Hire software packages, like most businesses, can be split into two very distinct areas - Operations (Front Office) and Administration (Back Office). So often the success of your business will depend on how

well these two areas can work together and your software is no different. The great thing about software though is that it does as it is told and will therefore not spend half its working life arguing about why one area is more important than the other.

One of the best examples of how integration works in Hire software is when you raise an Invoice for a customer. Depending on the information entered onto the Invoice the following include some of the files that will automatically be updated. Equipment file, Inventory file, Customer file, Accounts Receivable and all the applicable General Ledger accounts, eg. Sales Income, Rental Income, Damage Waiver, Stamp Duty, Sales Tax, Deposits, etc. In an integrated system this

information flows automatically through the system, from the Front Office or "Counter", where the Invoice is raised to the Back Office where all the accounting functions are performed and as we said earlier, no arguments along the way! This example should also give you a clear indication of how important it is to have your system setup correctly so that the relevant information will flow through to the correct areas of your system.

The front counter is another area which benefits greatly from integration. For example when generating a quote, reservation or contract as soon as you enter the customer name or account number the system will immediately display all the relevant information about that customer ie their account details, whether they owe you money or not, what discounts or special rates they may be entitled to, whether they pay damage waiver and any other relevant information pertaining to that customer. Back Office staff can "flag" messages for the Counter staff about certain customers. These messages will appear on the screen every time that customer is called up at the counter. The same applies to all items of equipment being rented. You will immediately know whether an item is available or not and what rates apply to that particular item. If an item is not available the system will be able to tell you where it is and when it will become available. A truly integrated system will also link your branches so that information is accessible at all branches. It will also allow items to be transferred between branches while creating an audit trail to track their movement and revenues.

Obviously the major benefit to be derived from an integrated system is that there is no double or in some instances even treble handing of information. Not only does this mean great savings in time and we all know time is money, it also limits the number of areas in the system where errors can be made. For

smaller companies who utilise external Accountants there can be very significant savings made by providing your Accountant with detailed reports instead of the traditional "carton full of dockets" which then have to sorted. be dissected and "massaged" into



something meaningful for the Tax department. A fully integrated system will also provide you with vital information regarding the financial state of your business a lot faster and much more accurately than a non integrated system. In simple terms it allows you to have all the information you require at your finger tips.

It is also important to ensure that any system you purchase can be integrated with a Word Processing package and even possibly a Fax Card. Integration at the Word Processing level can be very beneficial in the marketing area of your business or whenever you need to send out standard letters. For example if you wanted to send a letter to all those customers who had outstanding balances in 60 days you would generate a standard letter in the World Processor and then a macro would call the relevant customer names, addresses and balances and merge this information into your letter. This method can also be used when targeting specific information at individual market segments.

Having a Fax Card integrated with your system is great for countering those customers who constantly ask for copies of Invoices and Statements to be re sent. All you have to do is call up the relevant document and instead of sending the document to a printer you now send it to the fax. You can imagine the customers surprise when they receive a copy of the offending Invoice or Statement before they have even hung up the phone! A fax card will also work in very well with your Word Processor allowing you to fax all your quotes and mailers directly from the system. Good systems will also let you "print" your quotes and mailers to a file where they are stored until a pre-set time, late at night for instance, when they will then be processed. This is an excellent way of



saving someone from having to stand over a fax machine for hours at a time. You will also have significant savings on paper.

As you can see there are many benefits to be enjoyed by having a fully integrated computer system in your business and you should not settle for anything less. We hope this article will allow you to make a more informed decision when you start looking at systems for your business. Manslaughter trail urged

Sgt. John Naess, the officer assisting the Coroner in the inquest into the death of Conrad Nathan Bryan, on the Cairns Casino building, suggested that the four men appearing before the court all be committed for trial for manslaughter.

The fatality occurred when a cherrypicker was placed in a container, which was raised by crane to the second floor of the building project. Bryan then attempted to drive the cherrypicker from the container onto the second floor landing, causing the container to tilt, resulting in the cherrypicker plunging 12m to the ground.

The four men, the site foreman, site manager, and two dogmen, were working on the site at the time, Sgt Naess submitted they had some form of control or charge of the operation.

Their handling of the situation and the lack of safety precaution constituted enough criminal negligence to justify them being charged with manslaughter, Sgt. Naess declared.

The coroner after hearing submissions from the barristers representing the four men involved reserved his decision to a day to be set.

Modification of Pressure Washers causes loss of eye


There are two Liability Claims against Hire Companies in Queensland pending due to the removal of trissor hand pieces from high pressure washers, and replacing them with ballcock taps.

Both claims were in excess of \$200,000.

In both cases the plaintiff was using a washer with a tap on the wand and loss control of the wand, letting go of the tap, hence losing total control of the high pressure water flow. Both plaintiffs lost an eye in the incident.

If the wand had been fitted with a factory standard trissor valve hand piece, the high pressure laser would have been cut off the moment the hand piece was released. Resulting in no loss of eyes or bodily damage.

The moral of the story do not modify equipment to save a few dollars. The minimal amount of money saved in this venture could not possibly justify the risks involved.

Occupational Health & Safety

National Certification

Legislative changes which are in line with national initiatives for those using industrial equipment were introduced in NSW in April.

Certificate of competency requirements for users and operators of industrial equipment came a step closer to national uniformity with the gazettal of the The NSW Occupational Health and Safety (Certificates of Competency) Regulation 195)6. The Regulation, which came into force on April 22, makes significant changes to requirements for trainees, assessments and certificate holders. It covers certification requirements for those engaged in scaffolding, rigging or dogging, operating certain types of cranes, hoists, forklift trucks and other loadshifting equipment, boilers, turbines and reciprocating steam engines.

Trainees are no longer issued with permits and are now required to hold and maintain a log book, be over 17 years of age and work under the direct supervision of a certificate holder.

Auguard

To gain a certificate of competency appli

cants must be a« least 18 years of age and be assessed as competent by a registered assessor. A list of registered assessors and trainee logbooks are available from WorkCover NSW.

Each applicant is provided with an 'Assessment Summary which details whether they have met the required competencies in each part of the assessment.

Successful applicants will receive a 'Notice of Satisfactory Assessment' from their assessor which entitles them to work for 60 days while WorkCover NSW processes their application and issues the certificate.

There is no obligation for existing certificate holders to transfer to the new certificate system unless they are upgrading their skills and require further assessment





Getting the most from your advisers

Most people know they need an accountant for taxation purposes and a lawyer to check through a lease on their business premises. But an accountant and lawyer can do much more for your business. - how will you be charged: their hourly rate and an estimate of likely costs
- who will be your main contact in the firm: identify and meet all persons you are likely to have con tact with.

Feel comfortable with and have confidence in the person you choose.

• if you are not satisfied, get another adviser.

Remember they work for you, not you for them.

Some important points to remember:

- don't make a choice based on cost alone.

- don't choose someone you cannot communicate with easily

Air Tools

To use an Air Tool you need to have a pressure considerably higher than atmospheric pressure. Atmospheric pressure (14.7 P.S.I) pounds per square inch.

Air compressors use atmospheric air drawn in by reciprocating piston motion, usually driven by an electric or petrol motor and then compressed within the cylinder by the piston.

The compressed air is then transferred through the exhaust side of the cylinder into the storage tank and held until required.

A pressure regulating switch controls the motor stop - start (factory set to approximately 120PSI cut out - approximately 90 PSI cut in)

A relief valve controls the storage tank maximum pressure (125 PSI).

All Compressors with storage tanks should have adjustable pressure regulators, thus allowing the compressed air leaving the tank to be adjusted to a level suitable for the application.

A drain on the bottom of the compressor storage tank should be opened at the end of each days use to remove any atmospheric moisture that may have been drawn into the unit.

Note release all air pressure from the storage tank before opening drain.

Compressors + Air Tool hints

Extension leads and air hoses are critical to have sized correctly allowing compressor delivery specified and tools to receive ample capacity.

The maximum length of an air extension lead (15 amp cable) for a say 12 CFM Compressor should be no greater than 50 metres.

The length and diameter of a air hose from a Compressor to a tool should be sized to suit the particular tool.

The standard 3/8" (10mm) internal diameter air hose is generally suitable for small tools and also no greater than 50 metres.

The Newton Invention

A world-first - a sturdy, easy to use mechanical brick delivery system that revolutionised many parts of the building industry, was developed in Australia in the late 1940's. The inventor, Ron Newton never received any acclaim or awards for his invention, yet nearly 50 years later, nobody has been able to improve on Newton Brick and Block elevators and nowhere else in the world is a similar device available.

Newton was man with a vision far in advance of his time - if these Brick and Block elevators had suddenly appeared on the building scene in the 1980's their status as an 'Aussie icon' would be up there with other famous Aussie inventions like the wine cask.

Ron knew he was on a 'winner' but getting the people to actually lay out the money and purchase a very new and different product was another matter altogether. Showing the same initiative that he had in developing the Brick Elevator he decided that if the mountain would not come to Mohammed, Mohammed must go to the mountain. Ron quickly donned another hat and became one of Australia's pioneers in the Hire Industry.

Again Ron.judged well - Hire was a novelty, the modest cost of it a bargain and demand for his invention quickly grew in leaps and bounds. Back in the 40's, 50's and 60's Australian builders did know a good thing and over the decades he was kept pretty busy both hiring and selling Brick elevators. Some people liked the convenience of Hire which meant all repairs maintenance (not that much is needed with these machines) and storage was taken care of for them by the lessor, many others were purchased by small builders, building companies and renovators. They were very efficient and very affordable - there was no reason why every builder who preferred to have his own should not have one or more

By the 1980's however, their inventor and patent owner was very old and frail and had never received the recognition he deserved. He was still quietly producing his elevators, but never became part of the 'publicity machine' of the 1980's - a time when many new young people and companies were entering the industry and his still excellent invention became overlooked. Added to the brick elevators woes was the fact that in it's infancy so many were produced two (or more) elevators, with often minor problems (for which spare parts were readily available), were 'cannabalized' by short-sighted owners to make one good machine. As we head rapidly towards the millineum these machines are as good as ever but were becoming more and more hard to come by. Were, because, at almost the last minute the elevator industry has been revived.

Barry Newton, nephew of the inventor had worked alongside Ron Newton developing and building these machines in school vacations since he was 14 years of age. Later, after completing his apprenticeship he became a full time employee of Newton Brick Elevators. After a number of years Barry had many ideas he wanted to develop and action so he left to found Conveyor & Hoist Rentals but never lost his enthusiasm for or interest in Brick Elevators. In 1993 Newton Brick Elevators and Newton Block Elevators, which had left Ron's control and fallen even further into the 'doldrums' were returned to the 'Newton fold' and the Newton family now intend to get these great little labour savers quickly back up where they rightly belong.
